The meeting was called to order by President Schafer at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Chaput motioned to approve the agenda as submitted; seconded by Mr. Hanson. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Schafer gave an update to the board on the Be Legendary training. No motion was made.

Mr. Moore motioned to pay Tom Zaharia \$5000 for bus maintenance for 2025-2026 and for Tom to keep track of his time. Mr. Morrison seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed unanimously.

Cavalier County Commission Proceedings

On October 21, 2025, at 8:30 a.m. made on his payroll withholding with the Board of Commissioners of Cavalier County, North Dakota, met at the Cavalier County Courthouse in regular session. Stanley Dick was not in attendance. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Nick Moser called the meeting to order and proceeded as follows: Moser asked if there were any changes to the agenda. Shane Gallagher made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Greg Goodman; motion carried. Greg Goodman made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Austin Lafrenz; motion carried. The holiday schedule for 2025 was reviewed. Greg Goodman made a motion to add December 26th in addition to being closed per county policy on Christmas Day and closing at noon on Christmas Eve, seconded by Shane Gallagher, motion carried. The commission confirmed that only New Year's Day would be closed, per county policy. Terry Johnston, Road Supervisor; and Sheldon Romfo, Road Foreman; met with the commissioners to review current road projects. The estimate of federal aid funds was reviewed. Johnston reviewed reimbursements submitted for Special Road Fund and ER project; discussed a major structure in Osford Township that the state required the county to close due to the condition: and discussed a few ND DOT funded bridge removals. Shawn Brien discussed a data entry error that was
