### **PSC Schedules** Public Hearing for **Proposed Lighting** Waiver at the Badger Wind Project

BISMARCK, ND – The North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC) will hold a public hearing on Thursday, July 24, to gather public comments regarding a request for a waiver related to lighting requirements at the Badger Wind Project in Logan and McIntosh Counties.

Badger Wind, LLC, has filed a Request for a Waiver of Requirement to install a Light-Mitigating Technology System for 9 of the 92 wind turbines anticipated to be constructed on the Badger Wind Project. The waiver request is due to the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) determination to not approve the use of an aircraft detection lighting system (ADLS) on those 9 turbines and instead require that standard synchronized red lights be utilized on those towers. The FAA stated that the reason for the standard lighting on those towers is due to the proximity of the structures to the Wishek Municipal Airport and to ensure the safety of aircraft engaged in low-level, agricultural and/or helicopter operations. The hearing provides an opportunity for members of the public to contribute to the PSC's official record. Any comments from members of the public must be received at a hearing to be part of the record. People with concerns or support/ opposition to the filing are encouraged to attend the hearing and present their information. Information received after the hearing will not be part of the official record and cannot be used as a basis for the Commission's decision unless certain additional procedures are followed.

## Wishek mayor says warning siren works fine, but city looking to upgrade

WISHEK - The Wishek City Council has approved moving the warning siren to the new fire hall site, and plans to buy a new siren if it can find grant money to help with the purchase.

Mayor Brenda Dohn said if the city can find the funding, the plan is to buy a siren system that covers more square feet. A new siren and a backup generator will cost around \$38,000, and Dohn said the city is applying for grants now.

Dohn also wants to reassure the public that, although the city hopes to purchase a new siren, the current siren and system are both fully functional. The topic was discussed at this month's council meeting after concern from the public about its functionality.

"I want to reassure everyone that, yes, the siren is working," Dohn said. "When the National Weather Service issues an alert, we follow protocol and assess the need to sound the siren. In the case of a recent storm, we chose not to activate it, as it could have caused unnecessary panic."

Dohn said the siren will only be used when there is a direct and immediate threat.

The new fire hall on Beaver Avenue is expected to be complete in November. Until then, the current siren across the street from City Hall will stay in place.

It was also clarified at the city council meeting that the Wishek Civic Center will serve as a temporary shelter when storms are in the area, and the Wishek Armory is the designated emergency shelter.

Wishek City Council meetings are held the first Monday of every month, and are open to residents.
