MCINTOSH COUNTY **PROCEEDINGS** November 12, 2025 ... 9:15 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Neil Meidinger. Present were Jim Heinrich and James Goettle. Also present, Kristi Ebel, Glenn Herr, Steve Delzer and Alisha Ankers.

The Pledge of Allegiance

was recited by all.

The agenda was reviewed. Commissioner Heinrich wanted to add discussion on minimum maintenance roads and the valley road, and CDL's. Commissioner Goettle moved to approve the agenda with the mentioned additions, Commissioner Heinrich seconded. Motion carried.

The minutes of the October meeting read. There was one spelling error that needed to be corrected. Commissioner Heinrich moved to approve the minutes as presented. Commissioner Goettle seconded. Motion carried.

The financials were reviewed. Commissioner Goettle moved to approve the financials as presented. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Glenn Herr commented on the overweight permits. He is glad the County is looking into this.

Asst. States Attorney, Alisha Ankers and Sheriff Delzer met with the Board to discuss overweight permits and a permitting system for grain hauling. The suggested doing a resolution to do a seasonal permit. Sheriff Delzer did some research and presented what Richland County does and how the ND Highway Patrol does it. They want the commission to think about it. We need to contact someone from LoadPass.

Sheriff Delzer is looking to get a new vehicle in the Sheriff's Fleet. He had the following

Commissioner Goettle moved to purchase the vehicle from Pfeifle Ford of Wishek, ND. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. On the vote being taken, the following voted in favor thereof: James Goettle, Jim Heinrich, and Neil Meidinger. Against the same: None. Motion carried. It will be paid for out of the Sher-

The hearing for the Cities to agree or disagree with the appraised values that were put on the delinquent properties was held. Donald Kosel from the City of Ashley was the only attendee. He just had a few ques-

The new County Agent, Maddie Schauer, introduced herself to the commission. She asked what the starting wage would be for an Administrative Assistant. Commissioner Heinrich moved that the starting salary would be \$2,535.00/month plus benefits. Commissioner Goettle seconded. Motion carried.

Chris Opsahl, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board on the following matters: The insurance company wants to total the truck. They will pay us \$12,000.00. If the county wants to buy it back, they will pay us \$10,000.00. Chris feels we should purchase it and fix it, and use as a spare truck. Commissioner Goettle feels the county should buy it back and use it for parts, or fix it. Commissioner Goettle moved to buy back the truck. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. Motion car-

The bill from Allen Entzie was for gravel only.

Badger Wind farm contacted Chris. They would like to give the county the gravel that they do not need anymore. They also would give the county all the culverts they take out, for free. They would like the county to buy their remaining culverts for ½ price of new. Sizes are 18", 24", and 36". Cost would be \$22,092.54. Commissioner Goettle moved to purchase the culverts. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. Motion carried. Chris spoke with Brent Ulmer and Mr. Ulmer said the county could use his excavator. The rental price will be \$4,500.00/ month, so anytime we use it, that would be the price.

Marlow Werth met with the Board about his farm southeast of the Tabernacle. Mr. Werth graveled into the farm and he wants the county to pay for it because he feels it is a county road. No action was taken on this matter.

Chris asked if the county wants to purchase the dump trailer from RTS Shearing for \$37,000.00. Board decided to wait until the end of the year, Weed cutting was discussed. Some suggestions on how to handle this was to move the date up to September 15th. It was also mentioned to hire a utility person. Chris suggested that on October 1st, they go out and take pictures and that is how it would be billed, according to the pictures, not actually being cut. No action was taken on this matter.

The bids for gravel crushing were opened. There was only one bid as follows:

RTS Shearing, LLC - \$4.00/cu. yd. for 25,000 yards.

.....\$100,000.00 \$.85/cu. yd. for 50,000 yards for stripping and reclamation -

.....\$21,250.00. Commissioner Goettle moved to accept this bid. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. On the vote being taken, the following voted in favor thereof: Jame Goettle, Jim Heinrich, and Neil Meidinger. Against the same: None. Motion carried. Royalty fee would be \$50,000.00.

Minimum maintenance roads were discussed. Commissioner Heinrich stated that Logan County blades them because they are included in the certified miles that are reported to the State. He asked if our minimum maintenance roads are included in our certified miles. This will have to be checked into.

Commissioner Heinrich drove with Royce Fischer and toured the Valley Road, down by Royce Fischer's farm. The board discussed what to do with it.

Commissioner Heinrich mentioned that at the NDACo conference, it was discussed that county workers no longer need a CDL. The County Commissioner Association voted for it, and the County Superintendents Association voted against

The quote from Otis Elevator to modernize the elevator in the courthouse was reviewed. The base contract amount would be \$115,000.00. Board decided to start putting money aside for it.

The resignation email from Colin Neuharth from the Sheriff Department Chaplain was read. Commissioner Heinrich moved to accept the resignation. Commissioner Goettle seconded. Motion carried.

The raffle permit application from the Ashley Country Club was reviewed. Commissioner Goettle moved to approve the application and issue a permit. Commissioner Heinrich seconded. Motion carried.

The Application for Beer and/or Retail Liquor License from the Ashley County Club was reviewed. This is for an annual license. Commissioner Heinrich moved to approve the application and to issue the license. Commissioner Goettle seconded. Motion carried.

Gina Ketterling, County Auditor, asked the commission if the employees could have December 26th off as part of the Christmas Holiday. Commissioner Heinrich moved to allow this. Commissioner Goettle seconded. On the vote being taken, the following voted in favor thereof: James Goettle, Jim Heinrich, and Neil Meidinger. Against the same: None. Motion carried.

December 20, 1935

Governor William Langer acquitted at third trial on charges of illegal solicitation of political funds.

December 25, 1804

The American flag was raised over Fort Mandan by the Lewis and Clark Expedition, probably the first time that the flag floated over what was to become North Dakota soil.
