

JV Bearcat team defeated Beach Buccaneers 54-37 December 30

The junior varsity Bearcat basketball team closed out the 2024 year Monday, December 30 when they delivered an electrifying performance in front of a packed home crowd, securing a decisive victory over the Beach Buccaneers with a final score of 54-37.

The game showcased teamwork, resilience, and determination and kept fans on the edge of their seats until the final buzzer.

Freshman Reid Schneider led all scorers with 19 points, showing remarkable poise and skill for his first year on the high school team. Junior guard Austin Miller added 11 points, providing consistent scoring throughout the game. Freshman guard Colten Hellman added eight points, while Senior Aiden White contributed six.

Junior Kevin Dzuik scored four points but made a significant impact with his defense. Freshman Uriyah Dakken scored two points, displayed aggressive defensive play, and hustled for every loose ball. Sophomores Jaxon Kraenzel and Braden Belling

each chipped in with two points, rounding out a balanced team effort.

The game started with the Bearcats leading by one point at the end of the first quarter, but the Buccaneers gained momentum, fueled by their aggressive press and the Bearcats trailed 23-26 at the end of two.

The third quarter was a defensive masterpiece for the ‘Cats, as they held Beach to no points while scoring an impressive 23 points to take a commanding lead in the third quarter 46-26.

In the final minutes in the fourth quarter the ‘Cats dominant performance in the third quarter and steady play in the final period secured the win.

The victory improves the team’s record to 4-0 for the season.

The November police report was reviewed.

Court Report: City Attorney Scott Solem reported about the Dog Complaint Case. The dog owner had plead “Not Guilty”. Solem also stated that the owner no longer has possession of the dog. Solem concluded by saying that they will still have to go to court in January as far as fines.

Supervisor, Chad Stern discussed Christmas lights. He said there are five more

poles that need street lights. Schneider Brothers Electric would need to wire those. He said he would like all of Main Street to be lit. He talked to MDU about it and they said they wouldn’t raise our rates because the street lights are LED. Stern said Assistant Supervisor, Jesse Engle would be working on the Christmas lights since he welds and he’s local. He already made one light which is by the old Lapps Bakery. It’s made out of heavy rebar but he can make them with lighter material. Lights had already been approved by the Council but Stern wanted Engle to show his proposal to the Business Club (represented by Steve Maershbecker who was present at this meeting). The suggestion was made to give residents and businesses the opportunity to adopt a pole to help cover the cost of the light replacement. A motion was made to allow Jesse Engle to make Christmas lights for the City. Tibor/Torres MCU

Jason Gerving representing AE2S gave the Engineer’s Report and is waiting to receive the remainder of the CDBG Grant to the City for \$53,306.00. A motion was made to authorize a check for said amount. Tibor/Slinkard MCU

Supervisor Stern discussed the Lift Station. He said a lot of work needs to be done underground, one being the replacement of cast iron pipe.

Attorney Solem reported on the First Reading of the amended Garbage Ordinance. There was a motion made for the First Reading of the Ordinance #24-03. Dittus/Slinkard MCU

Supervisor Stern reported that the kitchen door in the Hebron Community Center needs to be replaced. A motion was made to replace the door. Tibor/Torres MCU

The City received a notice from Southwest Water that there was no increase in the contract water rates. The Council tabled discussion on increasing water rates to a later date.

The Council meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm. Dittus/Torres MCU
