Annual Update. The number of  
books and periodicals on hand  
is 15,581. 192 books were ad-  
ded, 16 books were lost, in house  
checkouts for the fiscal year was  
2,312. There were 2,737 over-  
drive checkouts and 48 books  
withdrawn from circulation. There  
were 27 new patrons added. The  
catalog website usage was 2,068  
and the total number of patrons  
was 1584. Sharp reported that  
the carpets need cleaning and  
there are some roof leaks that  
need to be addressed. Jessica  
Hawks is representing the mem-  
ber on the library board for Eddy  
County. James F. Allmaras made  
a motion to reinstate Jessica  
Hawks for a one-year term. Dave  
Gehrtz seconded the motion. All  
were in favor. Motion carried.

Cindy Schmidt with Lake  
Region Public Health discussed  
avenues for opioid settlement  
spending. Options discussed  
were: a Narcan dispensing box,  
a prevention program called Pre-  
Venture and a program called Op-  
eration Parent. Samples of prod-  
ucts were shown and discussed.

Lisa Thompson discussed  
grants and updated the commis-

sion on the status of the Home-  
land Security Grant. As of August  
1, 2025 the floodplain authority  
in townships is granted to Eddy  
County. If any townships would  
like to change the authority they  
can do so.

Madison Crisman, the Cen-  
tral Prairies Human Service Zone  
director gave update on depart-  
ment. Crisman reviewed case-  
loads and benchmarks for child  
protective services, and foster  
care/in home case management.  
Crisman also reviewed economic  
assistance direct care, childcare  
assistance and SNAP issuance  
for Eddy County. Care and Cust-  
ody of the deceased was also  
reviewed and discussed.

The following presented and  
reviewed budgets and gave de-  
partment updates: Denton Heisler  
with Lake Region Public Health,  
Julie Shrock VSO, Ashley Lies  
State's Attorney, Donna Young  
Weed Board, Travis Peterson Wa-  
ter Resource, Becki Schumacher  
Auditor, General, Capital Proj-  
ects, Senior Citizen, and Airport.  
Michelle Gilley, Tiffany Munson  
and Carrie Nichols Extension of-  
fice. Todd Weber Road Superin-  
tendent. Lisa Thompson, Emer-  
gency Management.

Paul White, CEO of PRC  
Wind gave update on the Flick-  
ertail Project. White reported that  
PRC has been working with fami-  
lies and individuals in and around  
the project footprint - both par-  
ticipating and nonparticipating.  
White reported that they have  
been successful in reaching all  
but 2 individuals - after multiple  
attempts. The design updates  
were shared, noting that the map  
is not complete, but getting close  
to finalizing.

Tiffany Harr, Recorder re-  
quested that they copy funds  
she receives go to the preserva-  
tion fund for future transactions.  
Dave Gehrtz made a motion that  
all copy funds from the Recorder/  
Clerk's office be deposited in the  
Preservation Fund. James F. All-  
maras seconded the motion, all  
were in favor. Motion carried.

The preliminary budget was  
reviewed, noting several changes  
and additions, a special meeting  
was set for August 11, 2025 to re-

meet at the Warsing Dam. It was  
agreed that NRS would need to  
fill out the agreement form simi-  
lar to having an event at the Eddy

County Fairgrounds.

James F. Allmaras made a  
motion to approve the Local  
Gaming Permit for Kulsrud Broth-  
ers at the Countyline Barn on  
August 23, 2025. Dave Gehrtz  
seconded the motion. All were in  
favor. Motion carried.

James F. Allmaras made a  
motion to approve the Application  
for Special Permit to sell alcohol-  
ic beverages for Stage Bar and  
Grille LLC at Kulsrud's barn on  
September 13, 2025 for a wed-  
ding dance and reception. Dave  
Gehrtz seconded the motion. All  
were in favor, motion carried.

Dave Gehrtz made a motion

at Kulsrud's barn on August 23,
