NOTICE FARMERS AND LANDOWNERS NOXIOUS WEED COST SHARING

The Wells County Weed Control Board will again do COST SHARING.

Cost Sharing is done on non crop land, such as hay land, pasture land, crp land, etc.

Producers are asked to provide:

- I. A **map** showing spots of each noxious weed sprayed along with legal land description and acres of each weed sprayed.
- 2. Photocopies of chemical invoices listing amount of herbicide cost and your social security number, which is now required for any dollar amount received.
- 3. Deadline to mail in your cost sharing is October 25, 2025.
- 4. Mail your cost sharing to Wells County Weed Control Board, P.O. Box 2, Fessenden, ND **58348-0002.** All cost sharing submitted must have a post mark.

Examples of Chemicals that will be cost shared on this year will be Tordon, 2,4D, Plateau, Overdrive, Milestone, Forefront, Chaparel, Escort XP, Cimmaron, Banvel, Latigo and Surfactants.

In accordance with Chapter 4.I-47-02. Control of noxious weeds - Responsibility. Each person shall do all things necessary and proper to control the spread of noxious weeds.

Penalties are provided for in Chapter 4.I-47-30 and Chapter 4.I-47-3I.

Pursuant to Chapter 4.I-47 in the North Dakota Century Code book, the following weeds have been declared

Absinth Wormwood Canada thistle Dalmation toadflax Diffuse knapweed Leafy Spurge Musk thistle Purple loosestrife

Russian knapweed Saltcedar Spotted knapweed Yellow toadflax Houndstongue Palmer amaranth

The Eddy County Weed Board is offering a cost share program for chemical for control of noxious weeds on qualifying land. Cost

NOTE: Each invoice submitted must have the requestor's name printed on it. We will NOT accept an invoice with the husband/dad's name on it and then it whited out and the son's/wife/daughters name written over the top or something like that. If you want to take advantage of the full reimbursement limits, plan ahead when you are buying the chemical. DO NOT expect us to try to fix it a few months later.

The reimbursement submission must have all (3) requirements listed above; or <u>it will be discarded</u>.
