2 C. mashed potatoes

flour (to make soft dough so you can handle it with your hands)
Directions:
Divide the dough into three parts. Put on floured board or table and just roll like a strudel, then cut them about one inch long and cook in boiling water. When they come up, stir a few times and drain off the water. You can fry them or put sauerkraut over them or cream-style corn.
