## District 7 tournament

This year marks the first year Beach has hosted districts and with seven other schools coming to play, it will make for an eventful weekend.

Here's a look into what schools will be competing against each other.

On Oct. 27, two play-in matches were held to see which lower ranking team would advance to districts. Hettinger/ Scranton faced Grant County and came away with a 3-0 win. Richardton-Taylor
