City Council Monthly Meeting Monday, November 3rd, 2025 Napoleon City Hall 7:30 p.m. (Subject to council review and approval)

Mayor Moos called the regular meeting to order. Alderman present: Rod Kleppe, Bob Humann, John Wald, Clark Haas and Mike

Pledge of Allegiance was recited

Additions to the agenda: Letter from Kelly Repnow, Toby Williamson building permit, and building by Napoleon Oil. Wald approved the additions to the agenda, Kleppe

seconded, motion carried No public comments received.

Wald motioned to approve the minutes as presented from October 6th, 2025, meeting, Kleppe seconded, motion carried. Haas motioned to approve the Special Budget Hearing minutes, Heying seconded, motion carried.

Kleppe motioned to approve the financial report, Humann seconded, motion carried. Auditor Fettig reported the Lodging Tax Fund, and the Walking Path fund have been corrected by Auditor Harold Rotunda and show the correct

amount now. Grant Dockter from Moore Engineering sent in the Engineer's Report. Mayor Moos informed the council that Change order 4 was changed to a Balancing Change Order to adjust contract price for overage on quantities which was requested by the funding agency. The dollar amount, \$108,311.70, which was approved last month remains the same. Haas motioned to approve the change order for Pay application 4, Heying seconded, motion carried. Humann informed the council that BND Infrastructure Revolving Loan Fund applications are being accepted. The amount available for new loans in the current application period is approxithe application deadline is December 5th, 2025. Humann said he talked with Grant from Moore Engineering and if the city is planning to do the city-wide chip sealing project next year that the city should apply to see if they could get approved for a loan even if the plan would change till next year. Humann made a motion to apply for the BND loan, Wald seconded, motion carried.

GARBAGE: Wald reported that garbage pickup will begin on the streets, Monday November 10th.

DUMP & LAGOON: Bjerklie was gone but it was reported that the landfill will close Saturday, Novem-

Wald motioned to pay all bills as presented except the one from Logan County for the culverts for the 4th St. Project, Haas seconded, motion carried.

ZONING PERMITS: Justin Piatzadd on to driveway; Jacob Bitz-egress window and replacing two additional windows; Elijah Hilzendeger-windows, doors, remove tree; Toby Williamson-replaced front door, fixed shingles. Kleppe motioned to approve all permits, Heying seconded, motion carried.

The Domestic Fowl ordinance was handed out with the changes that were discussed at the previous meeting. After finding a couple things that still needed to be changed and council members informing everyone of the comments that they received from residents it was decided that a vote should be held now since this ordinance change discussion has been going on for several meetings. Wald motioned to deny domestic fowl within the City of Napoleon and to leave ordinance the way it reads, Kleppe seconded, Heying opposed, Bjerklie was absent. Mayor Moos asked for all hands raised in favor of denying domestic fowl within the city, all hands raised except Heying.

An Ordinance of the City of Napoleon, North Dakota, to amend Ordinance 6.0608.3, pertaining to On-site Storage Containers. That section of the Ordinance shall be revised and amended to now read, as follows: Ordinance 6.0608.3, Section D, entitled "Permit Re-quired or Placement in Industrial or Commercial District," currently reads as follows:

A building permit is required prior to placement of an On-site Storage Container within any Industrial or Commercial District, with the exception of the downtown area as defined by the City Council. On-Site Storage Containers shall be prohibited in the defined downtown area. A \$20.00 fee is required upon approval of any permit.

Humann motioned to approve the second and final reading of Ordinance 6.0608.3, Kleppe seconded, all hands raised in favor, motion carried. Bjerklie was absent.

Wald presented an Agreement/ Guarantee that property owner Kelly Repnow would like signed by the city in regard to eminent domain of his property. It was decided that the agreement would be sent to the City Attorney to look at and inform the council if this is something they should be signing.

Kleppe asked the council if the city would be interested in the building by Napoleon Oil which is just a little removable shed put up by the people here cleaning up and taking soil samples from the fuel spill from years ago. After some discussion it was decided that Derrick Leier, owner of Napoleon Oil, should deal with it as he wishes since it is sitting on his property.

LCJDA, Eric Hoberg was a guest who informed the council that a state grant of 2.5M is available which you can apply for up to \$500,000 and he would like to have a city-wide planning meet-

ing to discuss options on what the city could use the money for if approved. It was decided that the meeting will take place on Monday, November 17th at 7:00pm at the White Maid.




