TODAY IN HISTORY

On Oct. 14, 1947, U.S. Air Force Capt. Chuck Yeager became the first person to break the sound barrier as he flew a Bell X-1 rocket plane over Muroc Dry Lake in California. In 2012, Yeager, at the age of 89, marked the 65th anniversary of that flight by smashing through the sound barrier again, this time in the backseat of an F-15.

In 1066, Normans under William the Conqueror defeated the English at the Battle of Hastings.

In 1586, Mary, Queen of Scots, went on trial in England, accused of committing treason against Queen Elizabeth I. (Mary was beheaded in February 1587.)

In 1910, aviator Claude Grahame-White flew his biplane over Washington, D.C., and landed it on West Executive Avenue, next to the White House.

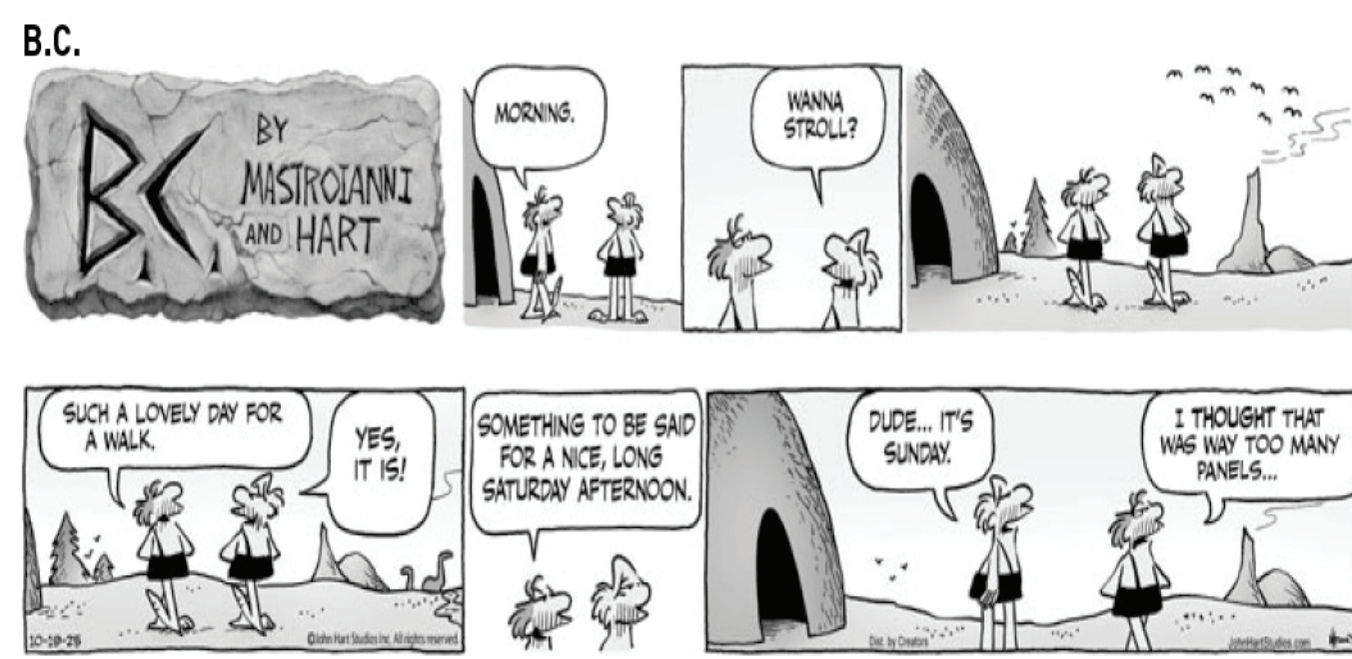
In 1944, German Field Marshal Erwin Rommel took his own life rather than face trial and certain execution for allegedly conspiring against Adolf Hitler.

In 1964, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. was named winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.

In 1964, in one of the greatest upsets in Olympic history, American Billy Mills, an Oglala Lakota, won the 10,000-meter race at the Tokyo Summer Games, setting a new Olympic record.

In 1981, the new president of Egypt, Hosni Mubarak (HOHS'-nee moo-BAH'-rahk), was sworn in to succeed the assassinated Anwar Sadat.

In 1986, Holocaust survivor and human rights advocate Elie Wiesel (EL'-ee vee-ZEHL') was named winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.

Barnes County Commission September 16, 2025 Valley City, ND 58072
The Barnes County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, September 16, 2025, with Bill Carlblom, Mike Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson and Shawn Olason present. Chairman Bill Carlblom called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m., roll call was taken, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the agenda was reviewed.

Planning & Zoning
A Variance Setback was presented for Tim Richman for placing drain tile within 75 feet of 38th St SE with several lines and an intake cage located in Springvale Township on Section 12-139-56. Pete Paulson made a motion to approve the variance application; Vicky Lovell seconded the motion. The motion carried with all members voting yes upon rollcall voted. Building permits were reviewed.

Highway Department
An approach application was submitted for Kevin O'Meara. The approach will be located in the SW¼ 29-140-61 in Eckelson township. Pete Paulson moved to approve the application; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. Dwight Groberg requested to replace a culvert on County Road 11 north of Sanborn with a larger culvert or add an additional culvert. Commission recommends looking at increasing culvert size when it is time to replace the culvert. RFP for the preliminary design and engineering on the Pederson Bridge replacement was discussed. Interviews with consultants and the interview committee will be rescheduled for September 25th.

Tax Equalization
Handling and scheduling hearings on abatements due to storm damage was discussed. Thirteen properties had complete loss on structures. Approxi-

mately \$14,700 in tax loss because of the damage. Consolidating hearings into one hearing township by township was suggested by Stacie to alleviate multiple hearings as well as talking to townships to set up hearings in December and bring all abatements to one hearing. This would enable the county to have one hearing at the county level to go through all the abatements. City of Valley City bought six properties and requested the properties be made tax exempt. These properties were not brought to the county to change prior to this request. In prior years, the tax was between the buyer and seller and the following year the property was made exempt. The property could not be changed mid-stream. This was presented to the States Attorney's Office for legal opinion.

Auditor's Office
Vicky Lovell moved to approve September 2, 2025, minutes as presented. Shawn Olason seconded the motion. Motion carried with all members voting aye. Vicky Lovell moved to approve Stacie Hansen as the NDA-CO delegate: Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. Michael Whisler would like to use the courthouse for the Valley Troubadours sing on December 15th at 7:00 p.m.

Commission Discussion
A request was received from the LaMoure County Commission to keep the current service contract rate of \$20,000 per year for the VSO position. Vicky Lovell moved to discontinue the VSO service contract with LaMoure County at the current rate of \$20,000; Shawn Olason seconded the motion. The motion to discontinue the service carried with Bill, Mike, Vicky, and Shawn voting yes and Pete voting no. The grant funds for the van service are finished. Economic Development will be returning childcare grant funds that

were not expended. Sanford Health is renting office space in the tech building. HFI would like to expand. Freedom Machine is down to four employees. Shawn attended the Water Board meeting. Geo Tech did a Clausen Springs dam study and are waiting for the results. There is a new contract for the trash rack. Hobart drain is not open. Sanborn drain is not open. Oriska Township has a water complaint. Buffalo Bridges Eligibility worker positions are fully staffed. The museum is hiring Arlene Andrus to work a few part-time hours to fill in until they find someone. Mike Schwehr is looking into bringing the jail nurse onto the county payroll. Jeremy Wolff will be doing some research and will bring it back to the commission. Ashley Horner is the Medical Director which would oversee the nursing position. The nurses take care of their training and licensing themselves. Bill reported there will be a walk through at the courthouse on Wednesday, September 17th for the HVAC system. With no further business, Shawn Olason made a motion, seconded by Pete Paulson, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously, with all members voting aye and the meeting was adjourned at 8:44 a.m. Bill Carlblom, Chairman Barnes County Commission Julie Mindt Barnes County Auditor

The Barnes County Commission met in a special budget session on Monday, September 22, 2025 at 5:30 p.m. with Bill Carlblom, Mike Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson present. Shawn Olason was absent. The 2026 Barnes County budget was discussed. Harold Rotunda, CPA, was in attendance to explain how the budget works with the 3% cap. The county can go by the same dollars levied in 2025 and bank the cap or they can choose to go by 2025 actual mills levied. The Auditor's Office will create a worksheet to show the difference between the requested budgets and the budget cuts. The next budget hearing is Wednesday, September 24, 2025 at 6:00 pm.
