Hunters Should Be Aware of Early Ice

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department warns hunters to be wary of ice conditions.

In some parts of the state, there are smaller waters that show the appearance of safe ice. Hunters should be cautious of walking on frozen stock ponds, sloughs, creeks and rivers.

Ice can form overnight, resulting in unstable conditions. Ice thickness is not consistent, as it can vary significantly within a few inches. Hunters walking the edge of a cattail slough will not find the same ice thickness in

the middle, as the edges firm up faster than farther out from shore.

- A few reminders:
- Snow insulates ice, which in turn inhibits solid ice formation, and hides cracks, weak and open water areas.
 - Avoid cracks, pressure ridges, slushy or darker areas that signal thinner ice. The same goes for ice that forms around partially submerged trees, brush, embankments or other structures.
 - Daily temperature changes cause ice to expand and contract, affecting its strength.

No other commissioners were present. Therefore, a quorum was not met. Yondr Presentation Commissioner Carlblom set up a Teams Meeting with Yondr to discuss how their security pouches work. These pouches are used in schools and court systems to lock up electronic devices so they cannot be used during court processes. Sheriff Randy McClafflin, Pat Sand, Wanda Auka, and Tonya Duffy attended the presentation and were able to ask questions and hear the responses from the Yondr representatives. Barnes County Commission November 4, 2025 Valley City, ND 58072 The Barnes County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 with Bill Carlblom, Mike Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson, and Shawn Olauson present. Chairman Bill Carlblom called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m., roll call was taken, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the agenda was reviewed. Sheriff's Office and Judge Thornton Judge Nicholas Thornton and Sheriff Randy McClafflin appeared to discuss security and lockers during court hearings and trials. Emma Buttkie would be willing to provide security during trials and hearings. However, to provide personnel for the court, a full-time office deputy would need to be hired for the Sheriff's Office. Bill Carlblom made a motion to have Emma provide court security and the sheriff's office hire a full-time office deputy; Shawn Olauson seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously upon roll call vote. The pay rate will be discussed and determined at a later date. Security cell phone pouches from Yondr were available for demonstration. A quote from Yondr was presented for \$3,750.00. Bill Carlblom made a motion to approve the Yondr quote; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried with all members voting yes upon roll call vote. Back the Blue Grant Pat Sand and Jeremy Wolf presented a schedule of how they would like to see the money from Back the Blue Grant distributed, with the amounts paid to Sheriff's Office and Correctional employees based on years of service. Vicky Lovell made a motion to follow the presented schedule for disbursing the Back the Blue dollars as presented in the schedule; Pete Paulson seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. Auditor's Office The motion on October 21, 2025 to "move forward with the transfer of the nurse to corrections with the understanding Karen Bundy's vacation and sick leave balances be paid out by City County Health before transferring over and Karen's years of service will be moved over with her" was discussed and amended to read that the county will move forward with transferring Karen over to corrections from City County Health, striking the vacation and sick leave balances and years of service from the motion. Vacation and sick leave and year of service will be discussed at a later date. Shawn Olauson moved to approve October 21, 2025, with changes as discussed, October 29, 2025, and November 3, 2025 minutes as presented. Pete Paulson seconded the motion. Motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. A court facilities grant for the HVAC system was discussed. Bill Carlblom made a motion to go ahead with the application. Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. The Notice of Real Estate Forfeited to the County for Delinquent Taxes was presented and discussed by the commission for appraisal of property. The appraisal totals set by the board includes the estimated 2025 tax. Parcel #29-2210110 recently had the 2022 tax paid but the 2023 and 2024 tax still remain unpaid since the list had been sent out. This total will be adjusted to reflect the payment. Parcel # 52-0100340 had higher special assessments than the previous year. The 2025 estimate will be adjusted to reflect the change. Vicky Lovell moved to approve the Notice of Real Estate Forfeited as presented with changes; Pete Paulson seconded the motion. The motion carried with all members voting yes. A Local Permit Raffle application for the Sobduster Club was presented. Vicky Lovell made a motion to approve the application; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried with all mem-

The insurance check is \$58,000 and the bill to fix the door approximately \$90,000. They are not accepting the check because of the difference. They are going back to the Farmers Union agent to find out why it is so low. LEPC meeting was talking about more training, disaster response, updating the Hazard Mitigation Plan, basic first aid for high school students. Veteran Service Office had 2,879 miles put on the van with 50 rides. Shawn Olauson reported LI-HEAP will be funded through the end of this year and WIC will be funded to the end of the month. Insurance rates are reported to be going up substantially which will bring in more clients looking for help. Food Pantry is taking donations. Mike Schwehr attended the City County Health District meeting. They are busy with the respiratory season. They would like to wait to transfer Karen to corrections until January 1. Vicky Lovell missed the SCDRC meeting because of the annual NDACO convention. Bill Carlblom attended the annual NDACO convention in Bismarck. He had some good ideas for the highway department. Questions on raises were brought up. Normally raises are across the board and if the board would be willing to do anything more. Consensus of the board is that the raises are across the board and with the 3% cap, we could run into issues doing anything more. Services may need to be cut.
