Slow down. One of the most important things to remember when driving in snow or ice is to reduce your speed. Maintain a sturdy grip on your steering wheel and move forward at a slow and steady pace, changing to a higher gear for more control if you drive a manual car. Remember to maintain a safe stopping distance from the car in front of you, too. Navigate bends

carefully. When approaching a bend, it's best to brake before you start turning your wheel. If your car loses grip
