



(9:11, 18, 25)</p>	<p>Grand Forks Air Force Base, North Dakota Public Notice: Complete Fifth Five-Year Review for Grand Forks Air Force Base The U.S. Department of the Air Force (Air Force) has completed the Fifth Five-Year Review of the environmental remedies implemented at six Installation Restoration Program sites at Grand Forks Air Force Base (AFB), North Dakota. The North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality provides regulatory oversight support concerning environmental cleanup measures. Five-Year Reviews are required by Air Force policy and are conducted in accordance with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), commonly known as Superfund, and the National Contingency Plan or NCP. The purpose of a Five-Year Review is to evaluate the implementation and performance of a remedy to determine if the remedy is or will be protective of human health and the environment. Five-Year Reviews also identify issues discovered during the review, if any, and provide recommendations to address them. The Five-Year Review Report documents the methods used for the review, and the findings and conclusions based on a records review and a site inspection. The Fifth Five-Year Review includes evaluation of the following sites: FT002 (Fire Training Area/Old Sanitary Landfill Area) – The remedy at FT002 is protective of human health and the environment. The landfill cap is maintained in good condition to reduce and potentially eliminate recharge by precipitation into the landfill cells and reduce percolation of surface water into the soils, eliminating the seep. Monitoring data indicate there are no increases of contaminant of concern (COC) concentrations in groundwater or surface water. LF003 (New Sanitary Landfill Area) – The remedy at LF003 is protective of human health and the environment. The landfill cap is maintained in good condition to reduce and potentially eliminate recharge by precipitation into the landfill cells and reduce percolation of surface water into the soils and eliminating the seep. Engineering controls, including the landfill cap and signage, are maintained to eliminate direct contact with the waste, contaminated soil, and groundwater. Monitoring data indicate there are no increases of COC concentrations in groundwater or surface water. ST007 (Petroleum, Oil, and Lubricant Storage Tank) – The remedy at ST007 is protective of human health and the environment. Groundwater injections have been successful at creating an environment conducive for natural attenuation of COCs in groundwater. Concentrations are exhibiting a decreasing trend at wells with high concentrations of benzene, TPH-DRO, and TPH-GRO. There is also no evidence of plume migration. ST008 (Refueling Ramps and Pads/Hydrant Fuel Supply System) – The remedy at ST008 is protective of human health and the environment. Groundwater monitoring results and groundwater quality measurements from 2021 indicate conditions continue to be favorable for natural attenuation of COCs at ST008. There have been no changes to exposure pathways, and a dig permitting program is in place to notify workers of potential risks should excavation activities occur. TU503 (Building 501) – The remedy at TU503 is protective of human health and the environment. Groundwater monitoring results and groundwater quality measurements indicate conditions continue to be favorable for natural attenuation of COCs at TU503. Concentrations of COCs in 2023 were below cleanup goals established in the 2007 Statement of Basis. TU504 (Former Building 539) – The remedy at TU504 is protective of human health and the environment. The phytoremediation trees established hydraulic control of the contaminated shallow aquifer by shifting groundwater flow from south to north to an inwardly flow towards the phytoremediation plot. There is no evidence of contaminant migration. Decreasing trends for COCs show that hydraulic fracturing and injections have made conditions favorable for natural attenuation of COCs. There continues to be no potential for acute and chronic human health risk. Roll call was taken and the following members were present: Commissioners Hodous, Frith, Volk, Wilhelmli & Gessner. Those present and recited the pledge of allegiance. Motion was made by Commissioner Frith, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelmli to approve the minutes of the June 3, 2025 meeting. All members voted "AYE". Motion carried. Motion was made by Commissioner Frith, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelmli to approve the Treasurers Checks in the amount of \$1,664.86. Roll call was taken and the following members voted "AYE". Commissioners Hodous, Frith, Volk, Wilhelmli & Gessner. Motion carried. Motion was made by Commissioner Hodous, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelmli to approve the agenda as presented. All members voted "AYE". Motion carried. Jason Kraft, Ramsey County Highway Superintendent reported on the following: • Soft spots: we are currently working on repairing RC 9 from State 20 to RC 3 as it is set to be gravelled soon so we started there, blades are working to fix/improve all the others, we will have more discussion to come on permanent fixes once we see how many do not dry or heal up. • There are 2 rusted out center line culvert on RC 9, East of Steve Neilson's, these are 0.25 miles and 0.75 miles east of State Highway 20, they are 24"x 72" long, we will be removing and replacing ourselves with same size culvert from our yard stock. • Salt storage facility: We received 1 bid for construction of our Salt Storage facility, it was from Gleason Construction, they did not meet all bid requirements, so it was an acceptable bid, the bid price was \$55,850.00. • Motion was made by Commissioner Volk, seconded by Commissioner Hodous to accept and award the only bid to Gleason Construction for construction of the Salt Storage Facility at the Devils Lake Shop. All members voted "AYE". Motion carried. • 2027 Transportation Alternatives (TA) Project Update: Paul from KIJ wrote for a grant for our RC1 bike pathway, we have been awarded \$348,872.00 for the project. Cost is as follows: local share or match on construction is \$82,207 (19.07%) there is design construction (\$40,000) 100% local share and project inspection (\$50,000) which is 100% local share as well, (these costs are estimates). • Motion was made Commissioner Frith, seconded by Commissioner Hodous to accept the 2027 Transportation Alternatives (TA) Project Grant in the amount of \$348,872.00 for the RC1 Bike Pathway construction in 2027. All members voted "AYE". Motion carried. • Mag water: do we want to offer the Mag Water program again where people who live along a county road can request to be on the list to get dust control? In the past we have offered a 75% County pay 25% private or resident pay share program. Program cost will be around \$13,500 total going of off the \$2.08 per gallon price quote from Todd Haley. I have no mileage quote from him so I figured it with no increase/using same mileage as 2024. Ramsey County is going to be around \$10,000-\$11,000 and residence paying \$2,900-\$3,000 using these numbers for calculations. • Motion was made by Commissioner Volk, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelmli to approve the mag water on county roads with the 75% County 25% private for this year and will take a look at budget time for the 2026 year. All members voted "AYE". Motion carried. • South Minnewaukan 89th Ave, we have received a request for payment on Prospective Estimate 1 from Close Construction for \$40,424.70. • Motion was made by Commissioner Frith, seconded by Commissioner Hodous to approve the Chairman to sign the Prospective Estimate #1 for Twp-0036(025) 89th Ave NE South Minnewaukan Twp in the amount of \$40,424.70. Motion carried. • Brian Anstad would like to install a field access on RC 9 just east of RC 31 in the west side of the big slough as he can longer get access from the East side, he will supply all the fill and has his own pipe, he will make it to standard 24 ft top and 4 to 1 side slopes. • Motion was made by Commissioner Frith, seconded by Commissioner Wilhelmli to approve the request from Brian Anstad to install a field access on RC#9 just east of RC#3. The Highway Department will make sure it is built to spec. All members voted "AYE".
