When asking Lisa Harpster of Paws to Claws Rescue why the kitten rescue was no longer available, Harpster said that you need community buy-in. She said her and another rescuer started rescuing kittens. Everything was out of their own pockets for expenses, veterinarian costs, food, litter, and the time commitment for caring for the animals. They were able to rehome the kittens before dissolving their rescue, but they didn't have even one community member support them, Harpster said.

If individuals are unable to help by adopting, a kitten or helping with supplies, maybe someone knows of grants or other assistance that could be available. Those pieces of information might assist rescue efforts going forward. Harpster said having a veterinarian to help with spaying and neutering and vaccinations is so key. Those are basic needs. Even if farmers or ranchers are willing to take rescues they want disease-free kittens or cats that cannot reproduce. Community support and veterinarian assistance is crucial, Harpster said.

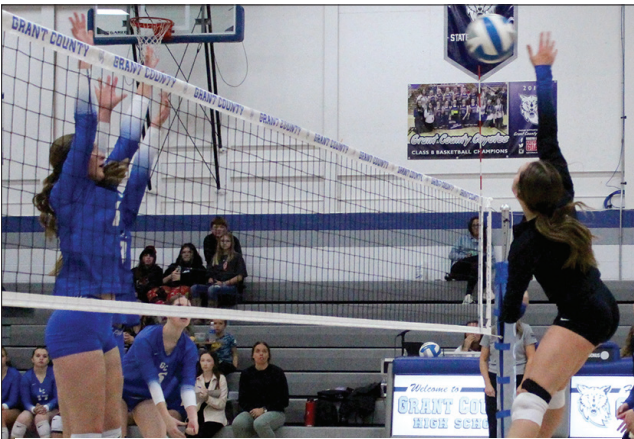
