We can help you save with Lifeline.

Verizon Wireless participates in the Lifeline program, which is a government assistance program that offers qualified, low-income customers a discount on their monthly wireless service. Only eligible customers may enroll in the program. Additional discounts are available for eligible residents of Tribal lands. In addition to Lifeline, Link Up assistance provides qualified residents of Tribal lands a one-time waived activation fee for new wireless phone service.

You may be eligible for a Lifeline discount if you currently participate in a qualifying public assistance program or otherwise satisfy the federal income requirements. The Lifeline discount is limited to a single line of service per household. Eligible customers may apply the Lifeline discount to either one landline or one wireless number, but you cannot have the discount on both services. Other service providers may use terms other than “Lifeline” to describe the Lifeline discount. The Lifeline service may not be transferred to any other individual. Applicants may be required to present documentation of household income or participation in qualifying programs. Consumers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain the benefit can be punished by fine or imprisonment, or may be barred from the program.

To apply for Lifeline service, you must use the National Verifier. To see if you qualify, go to: lifelinesupport.org. You can also print and mail a copy of the application. Once you have applied and been approved, call us at 800-417-3849. Lifeline is only available in limited areas in Iowa, New York, North Dakota and Wisconsin where Verizon Wireless has been designated to offer these programs.

Tues., Nov. 4: Sausage, sauerkrat, mashed potatoes, chilled peaches, green beans, milk, coffee.

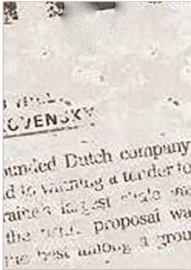
