MAY 5, 2025-MINUTES

The Enderlin City Council met for their regular monthly meeting on Monday, May 5, 2025 at 7:00 P.M. in the City Auditors Office with Mayor Deon Maasjo presiding. Council Members present were: Shelly Hanson, Tim Michaelson, Roger Maras, Kevin Bunn and Kayl Hamre. Terri Egan absent. Others attending were: Tracy Ekeren, Fallon Kelly, Joe Mathern, Randy Jawaski, Debbie Erickson, Darren Benneweis, Emily Wolf and Cyndee Chesley. Bunn made a motion to adjourn last month's meeting, seconded by Maras. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. Michaelson made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Hanson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. Bunn made a motion to approve the treasure's report, seconded by Hamre. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. Bunn made a motion to approve the payroll paid in the amount of \$30,839.23, check numbers 45706-45714 and 45730-45751, seconded by Maras. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **MOORE ENGINEERING -WATER IMPROVEMENT DIST. 2024-1** Tracy Eslinger submitted a written report. NDSU has conducted several separate tests and will prepare a preliminary report in June. Moore will use that report to prepare a preliminary design. He is also working on applications for funding of this project. **-WATER MAIN IMPROV. DIST. 2019-1** In Eslinger's written report, he is working on closeout documents with LTP which were sent to them the end of March. **-INTERSECTION WIDENING BROADWAY AND HWY #46** No discussion. **-WATER SERVICE LINE INVENTORY** Eslinger stated in his written report that the ND Dept. of Environmental Quality (NDDEQ) has authorized Moore Engineering to perform additional work on the water service line inventory for the City. This is all paid by NDDEQ. The goal is to reduce the number of unknowns on the inventory. They will be going door-to-door in the city within the next few weeks. **COMMUNITY AFFAIRS ADVOCATE** Tracy Ekeren informed the Council that the CDC did a ribbon cutting at Annabelle's and Maple River Saloon & Eatery. The Curb Appeal has been put in the Independent and on Facebook. Ekeren presented a draft of the Summer Every Door Direct that she is working on. Food Sustainability Grant-Deputy Auditor Wolf gave an update. 523 responses were received and she is working with Strengthen ND in compiling the information from the surveys. The monthly activities were listed in her report. **PUBLIC WORKS SUPERINTENDENT** Rick Gillund submitted a written report. WesTec did get the 2 main bearings & sprockets in the last 2 contact basins and they are up and running. Clean-up week is this week with the curbside pick on Friday, May 9th. Items need to be out by Thursday night. This is for City residents only. Residents need to remove their garbage totes and vehicles from the streets Thursday night for street sweeping on Friday mornings. They are patching potholes and will be flushing hydrants sometime this month. Gillund informed the Council that the roof is leaking above the lab at the Water Plant and he will have a contractor look at it. They will be working on equipment at the Water Plant during ADM's shut down. The water is on at the swimming pool and My Aquatics will be here on the 5th to get the equipment running. They have put Larvicide in the standing water around town to help control the mosquito population. Residents can help by not leaving standing water sit and getting rid of any tall grass on their properties.

Mayor Maasjo informed the Council that a letter of non-renewal of the lease for the JD Motor Grader. RDO is looking for a smaller used unit for the City. Mayor Maasjo explained to the Council that the Kenworth truck has a twisted frame and is not in good shape. Oakes Truck & Trailer has a 2016 Kenworth for \$63,000.00. They would take the box off our truck, repair it, put the plastic liner back in and put it on the new truck. The Council would like more information, hours, etc. Mayor Maasjo will get more information and get it to the Council. Randy Jawaski, Fat Man Trash, questioned the curbside pickup items. The Council stated no tires, mattresses, metal or appliances are to be picked up. Residents are to bring the metal and appliances behind the shop for disposal. Jawaski stated it is \$60.00 to dispose of a mattress or boxspring. Jawaski asked if the Council had any issues with the regular garbage pick-up and the Council has not had any issues. **DESIGNATE OFFICIAL NEWS-PAPER** Bunn made a motion designating the Enderlin Independent as the City's official newspaper, seconded by Hanson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE Pursuant to NDCC 40-47-05(3)** the City Council discussed the grounds for the zoning amendments and determined that the grounds are for the safety of the community and to come into compliance with laws relating to flood insurance. Bunn made a motion approving the 2nd reading and publication of the Floodplain Ordinance, seconded by Hamre. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **SALES TAX ORDINANCE** With no changes being made from the 1st reading, Michaelson made a motion approving the 2nd reading and publication of the Sales Tax Ordinance, seconded by Maras. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **GAMING/RAFFLES** The Thundering Saints, Inc is requesting a Gaming Site Authorization at the Maple River Saloon & Eatery. Bunn made a motion approving the request, seconded by Hanson. All Council Member present voting aye, motion carried. The Enderlin Youth Baseball is requesting a calendar raffle for the month of August. Maras made a motion approving the request, seconded by Hanson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT** Queen Pin, Inc dba Sparetime Lounge is requesting a Special Event Permit on May 31, 2025 for an Indies Tournament at Hendrickson Field. Bunn made a motion approving the request, seconded by Hanson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. **BUILDING PERMITS** Council member Maras approved the following building permits: Dwight Fraedrich at 401 Railway for 2 overhead doors, John DeVries for a new shop & greenhouse and RD Land Development to add walls in the shop for CPKS Rail. **CODE VIOLATIONS-ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING(S)** No discussion necessary. **OTHER BUSINESS** Ransom County Sheriff Darren Benneweis attended the meeting for any questions or concerns the Council may have. The Council stated that there has been issues with people not stopping at the 4-way stop on Railway & 11th Ave. as well as speeding. Mayor Maasjo informed Benneweis that he has a CPKS Rail contact for the trains blocking the crossings. Benneweis will follow-up with the complaint from a resident of dog feces left in their yard. Joe Mathern, City Assessor, presented the Council with Obsolescence options for the No Curb & Gutter (can only be applied to parcels where the "Front Foot" side does not have a curb) and Irregular Lots (can only be applied to any lot that is not a rectangle or square) for the valuations that were disputed at the Equalization meeting on April 8, 2025. Mathern's recommendation is a 5% No Curb & Gutter and 10% on Irregular Lots. After a length discussion, Hamre made a motion to place a 5% on the No Curb & Gutter and 15% on the Irregular Lots, seconded by Michaelson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried.

The Council requested hat notices be sent to all of the residents that signed the Dispute list concerning their valuations. The Council and Mathern discussed the Non-buildable property. Hamre made a motion to handle the lots disputed on a case-by-case basis between the owner and tax assessor, seconded by Hanson. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. Mathern requested a number to work with for those Non-buildable properties for this year. After some discussion, Bunn made a motion to apply a 50% reduction of the assessed value on the Non-buildable Lots for this tax cycle only, seconded by Michaelson. Hanson, Michaelson, Maras, Bunn voting aye, Hamre voting nay, motion carried. Auditor Chesley informed the Council that the recorder for the security camera system at the city office/shop has been malfunctioning which caused issues with our phone system and internet. Chesley requested a quote from MLGC for a new security camera/recorder system. The quote is \$2,460.94 not including labor. Bunn made a motion for the 8-channel recorder, the Knight Guard Cameras and up to \$2,500.00 for labor, seconded by Maras. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. Maras made a motion approving the advertising request of \$125.00 from HEART for the golf scramble, seconded by Bunn. All Council Members present voting aye, motion carried. The City received a Safe Drinking Water Act Certificate of Achievement from the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality. Our Public Water System has satisfied all of the applicable Safe Drinking Water Act requirements and they are commended for this accomplishment from which our consumers benefit. Meeting recessed.

Gratis applications received on or before the regular deer gun lottery application deadline will qualify for an any-legal-deer license. As per state law, gratis applications received after the deadline will be processed based on licenses remaining after the lottery.
