Amendment of Articles and Sections in Chapter 14 to forbid residential structures less than an indicated square footage

The City of ENDERLIN will hold a public hearing after two consecutive weekly publications of this Notice to discuss Zoning Amendments covering the City of ENDERLIN. The hearing shall be held the 5th day of January, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall located at 411 Railway, ENDERLIN, ND 58027. The property involved includes the entire area of the City of ENDERLIN zoned R1, R2, R3, and Commercial, a map of which is available for inspection during the City's regular business hours. The nature, scope and purposes of the proposed changes is to require minimum square footage of residential structures in R1, R2, R3 and to require minimum square footage of residential portions of structures zoned as Commercial. The zoning amendments (amended ordinances in Section 14.0303) are available for public inspections during the City's regular business hours at the auditor's office at 411 Railway, ENDERLIN, ND 58027. BARNES COUNTY PEDESTRIAN
FATAL CRASH

What: Hit and Run Pedestrian Fatal Crash
Where: I-94, MM 282 (east-bound), approximately 8 miles west of Valley City
When: Sunday, December 21, 2025; after midnight, exact time is undetermined
Road Conditions: Dry
Weather Conditions: Dry
Crash Involvement: Under investigation
Type of Crash: Hit and run
Agencies Involved: ND Highway Patrol, Barnes County Sheriff's Office, Barnes County Coroner
Vehicle No. 1: Under Investigation
Pedestrian: Male, 27, residence unknown

NARRATIVE: On Saturday, December 20, 2025, dispatch received multiple 911 calls reporting a pedestrian walking along Interstate 94. Law enforcement made contact with the man and he declined assistance. Additional calls continued to be received throughout the evening, with the last report to dispatch occurring at approximately 10:55 p.m. On Sunday, December 21, 2025, at approximately 2:30 p.m., a passerby observed a body in the ditch and

called 911. The North Dakota Highway Patrol and the Barnes County Sheriff's Office responded and observed pieces of a vehicle consistent with a hit-and-run and located the pedestrian deceased in the same area.

The hit-and-run vehicle has not been identified or located. The NDHP is asking for the public's assistance looking for a vehicle with new damage that would have been in the area during the late-night hours of Saturday, December 20, 2025, or the early morning hours of Sunday, December 21, 2025. A large portion of a vehicle's bug deflector was found damaged and left at the scene. There may also be damage to the front and/or passenger side.

TION STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

The North Dakota Conservation District Employees Association (NDCDEA) established a scholarship for high school and college students interested in pursuing conservation education. The scholarship is open to high school seniors and college students who are residents of North Dakota and intend to or are currently pursuing an undergraduate degree in agricultural/natural resource management/environmental or related field at a two or four-year university in the state of North Dakota. Four scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$1,000 each.

Interested applicants are required to complete the application form and compose an essay of no more than 500 words on the topic chosen by the NDCDEA. Applicants will need to maintain at least a 2.5 GPA and be a full-time student. Scholarship will be paid after the President of the Association receives the previous semester's transcript. The \$1,000 will be sent to the school of attendance unless the recipient is a graduating college senior, in which case the scholarship monies will be paid directly to the recipient. If the scholarship winner does not maintain the 2.5 GPA, the second-place qualifier will be awarded the \$1,000. Applications and essays must be mailed by February 20th, 2026. Essays will be judged by the NDCDA board of directors. The scholarship winner will be notified following the selection.
