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
StormTRACKER Forecast







Highway Patrol identifies men killed in central North Dakota crash

McCLUSKY, N.D. — The North Dakota Highway Patrol has identified the two men killed in a crash Tuesday morning, July 8, near McClusky.

According to a release, Matthew Teumer was driving a 2004 Chevrolet Silverado southbound on Fifth Avenue Northeast, roughly 3 miles south of McClusky, at 9:45 a.m. when he lost control, entered the west ditch and rolled. Teumer and passenger Gavin Brauner, both 33-year-old

McClusky residents, died at the scene.

The North Dakota Highway Patrol is continuing to investigate the crash. The McClusky Fire Department, McClusky Ambulance and Sheridan County Sheriff's Office also responded to the scene

McClusky is 65 miles north of Bismarck.

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
