Partly cloudy skies with winds out of the NW at 15-25 mph. Slightly cooler, with highs in the mid 70s.

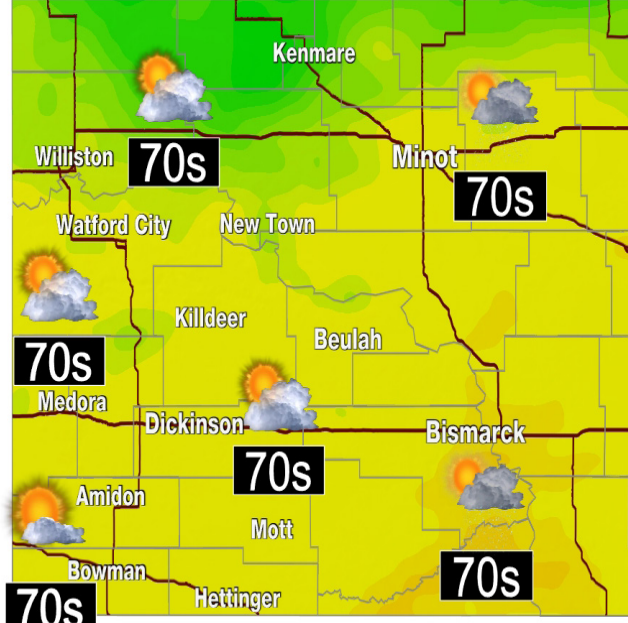



UV Index Today

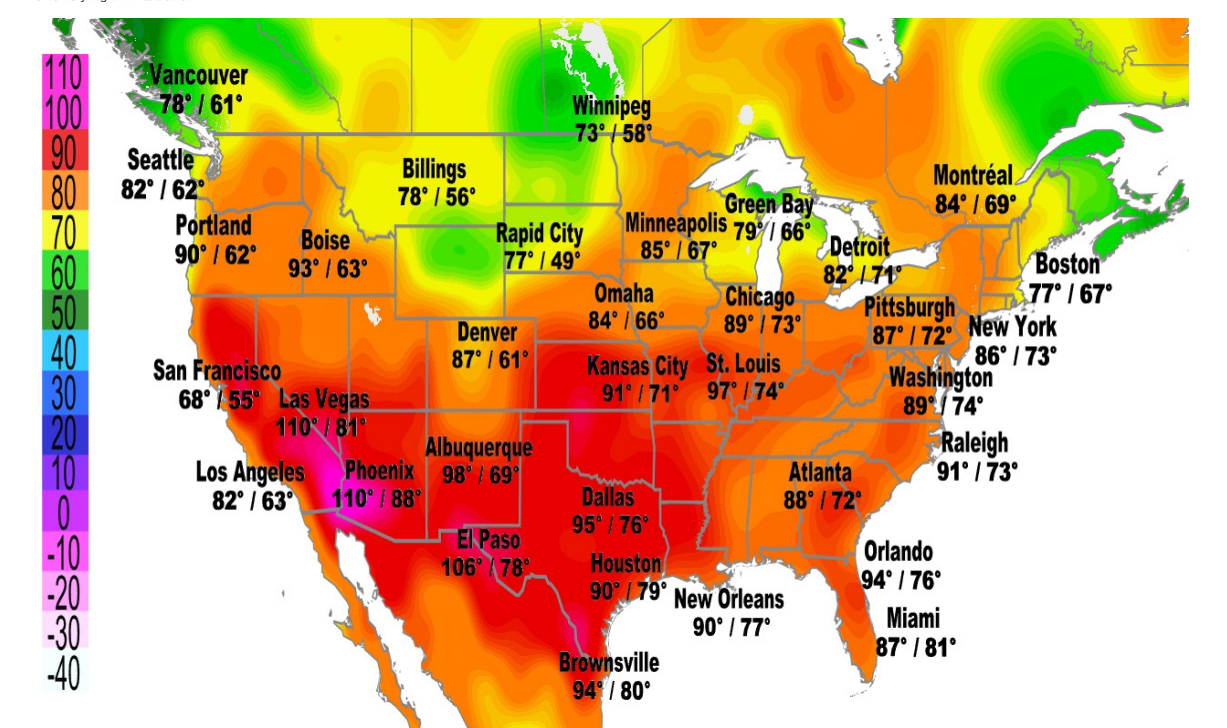

Military gallery groundbreaking scheduled Thursday in Bismarck

BISMARCK — A groundbreaking ceremony for the North Dakota Military Gallery is scheduled to take place Thursday, July 10, at the North Dakota Heritage Center and State Museum's outdoor Prairie Amphitheater in Bismarck.

Seating will open at 5 p.m. with the presentation of colors, followed by music from Clark's Creek Singers and the 188th Army Band, according to a release from the State Historical Society.

The ceremony will begin at 5:30 p.m. and be hosted by National Guard Historian Shirley Olgeirson.

Spectators can anticipate speeches from Gov. Kelly Armstrong, State Historical Society Director Bill Peterson, Adj. Gen. Mitch Johnson, Indian Affairs Commission Executive Director Brad Hawk and Brian Berg of Zerr Berg Architects.

After the ceremony, refreshments will be provided in the Northern Lights Atrium.

Highway Patrol identifies men killed in central North Dakota crash

McCLUSKY, N.D. — The North Dakota Highway Patrol has identified the two men killed in a crash Tuesday morning, July 8, near McClusky.

According to a release, Matthew Teumer was driving a 2004 Chevrolet Silverado southbound on Fifth Avenue Northeast, roughly 3 miles south of McClusky, at 9:45 a.m. when he lost control, entered the west ditch and rolled. Teumer and passenger Gavin Brauner, both 33-year-old McClusky residents, died at the scene.

The North Dakota Highway Patrol is continuing to investigate the crash. The McClusky Fire Department, McClusky Ambulance and Sheridan County Sheriff's Office also responded to the scene.

McClusky is 65 miles north of Bismarck.
