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grandmother, Maud, about the events surrounding Murrel’s death in the 1960’s. Maud had barely spoken about the tragedy in the decades since the trial.

“She was afraid,” said Lininger, describing the way Maud had refused to let her children out of the house and even overheard the men who’d killed her husband talk about ‘getting rid of them all so there would be no one left to tell the story.’

The book details the complex political dynamics surrounding the prosecution, a scene Lininger’s co-author and daughter, Kari Lininger-Downs likens to 1923, the prequel series to Yellowstone. With phraseology pulled from newspapers of the time, the duo have attempted to give readers an authentic, personal portrayal of the heart-breaking events of the summer of 1919 and the ensuing aftermath. Both Janice and her husband spent years combing through databases for documentation before bringing Kari onboard five years ago.

“It was in all of the newspapers at the time,” said Lininger-Downs, describing the corruption, social pressure and flawed justice system Bowen’s family faced.

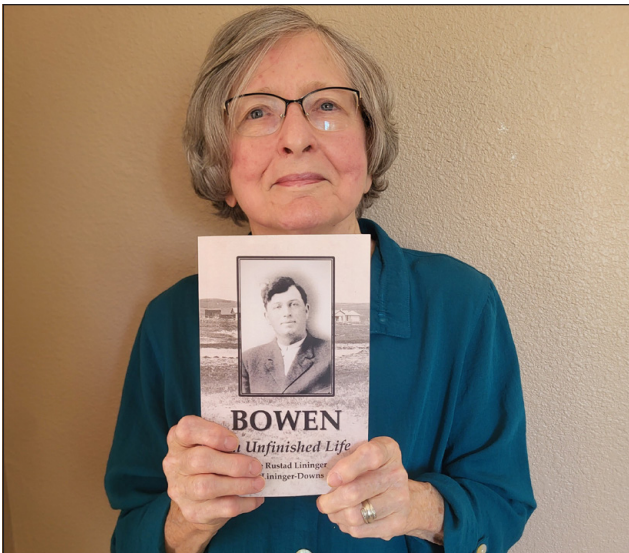

As for the authors’ goals, both want readers to recognize the value of shared history, the impact North Dakotans have had on the country, and most

of all, the priceless gifts of resilience and love.

“I think she’d feel a little bit of vindication, or maybe justice at last,” Lininger said, responding to a query about how her grandmother would feel about the book being published. “More than anything else, I think it was the love they had for each other that got them through, and the love the children had for their father.”

“It’s an important story to tell,” agreed Lininger-Downs.

access system and a new infant security system for the OB unit.

These purchases were made with a mix of funds from private donors and proceeds raised at the foundation’s two annual charity events.

Klaman said she hopes to raise \$25,000 at this year’s superhero golf scramble.

The funds will go toward the foundation’s goals of replacing all inpatient beds in the hospital’s MedSurg, OB and ICU units, as well as purchasing a Da Vinci surgical system.

According to the Cleveland Clinic, the Da Vinci surgical system is a robotic surgical device that allows surgeons to perform minimally invasive procedures across a wide range of specialties, including but not limited to colostomies, tonsillectomies, mitral valve repairs and hysterectomies.

Because the device allows for minimally invasive procedures, potential benefits include shorter hospital stays, smaller incisions, less blood loss and fewer post-op complications. However, drawbacks may include longer surgery times and higher patient costs.

Registration fees and future fundraisers:

Teams can register for \$400, which covers golf and dinner, or \$600 to include event signage featuring their company’s logo.

Teams can also rent golf carts for \$25 and purchase “power ups” — a package of golf handicaps — for \$50.
