



Native American history and Japanese American internment.

At the end of the ceremony, participants and spectators will be given the opportunity to place Tsuru, or paper cranes, or Native American prayer ties, in a crease in the memorial wall.

Speakers will detail Bismarck's connection to the Japanese American internment, describe the memorial design and recognize supporters and donors, according to a

UTTC press release. Satsuki Ina, co-founder of Tsuru for Solidarity and a member of the **Snow Country Prison** Advisory Committee, will talk about the memorial's significance. Her father,

Itaru Ina, coined the phrase "Snow Country Prison" in a haiku poem he wrote while incarcerated at Fort Lincoln.

Ina told The Forum in 2020 that her father rarely talked about his time at the prison. His haiku poem is about loss and pain, and the discrimination he and his family experienced before and during World War II.

"In the field of white

snow, I starve for the love of my own people." On display on Friday and Saturday at the UTTC Library will be the Ireicho, or the Sacred Book of Names, containing the names of 125,284 people of Japanese ancestry incarcerated in the U.S. during World War II. The book was compiled by Duncan

in its final phases before its planned opening on Friday, Sept. 5.

Williams, a reverend in Los Angeles, who is also a member of the Snow Country Prison Advisory Committee.

Dance performances will be conducted by TaikoArts Midwest, out of the Minneapolis area,

and the New York-based Aisawa Dance Theater. A documentary entitled "Defiant to the Last" about how the U.S. government tried to denationalize and deport Japanese American citizens, will also be featured.
