**FAMILY LAW** MEDIATION PROGRAM

[8] Any party to a guardianship proceeding may request a referral to family mediation. The Family Law Mediation Program provides up to 6 hours of combined pre-mediation orientation and mediation at no cost to the parties to attempt to resolve any disputes.

The requests shall be made during the initial appearance phase of the juvenile guardianship proceeding. A judge or referee may also order the matter into the Family Mediation Program at any time.

### Nicholas Boeddeker


Nicholas Lee Boeddeker, a beloved son, brother, and friend, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, December 13, 2025, at the age of 45.
