## Northland Health Center recieves grant

Northland Health Centers, in Turtle Lake, has received a grant from the Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota (BCBSND) Caring Foundation Building Healthier Rural Community (BUILD) Grants Program. This BUILD Program aims to transform the health and well-being of rural North Dakotans and address the social determinants of health affecting its communities.

Northland Health Centers was awarded \$4,000 to provide essential resources—such as food, clothing, hygiene supplies, and school supplies—to students and their families facing hardships. The goal is to help alleviate barri-

ers to learning and promote students' ability to focus, participate fully in school, and enhance their long-term well-being by fostering stronger school-community partnerships.

## Service animals are coming under more scrutiny by landlords

Landlords say some tenants try to keep pets in pet-free buildings or avoid pet fees by claiming their pet is an assistance animal or service animal. SB 2193, which is sponsored by Sen. Judy Lee, R-West Fargo, is intended to draw a sharper distinction between assistance and service ani-

Under the bill, a health care provider would need to be licensed in the state to be eligible to provide documentation that an individual needs an assistance animal.

The provision is aimed at individuals who get "documentation" from Internet providers that do little verification of a person's need for an as-

Opponents of the bill say it could make it more difficult for people who legitimately need an assistance animal to obtain housing, and could put North Dakota at odds with federal housing laws and regulations. They argued that the bill would affect outof-state students and workers who obtained their documentation from a health care provider outside North Dakota. SB 2193 passed the Senate 44-2 in January.

The House Agriculture Committee has yet to make a decision on the
