## Seatbelt patrols heightened until beginning of June

In an effort to save lives and reduce traffic injuries, law enforcement agencies across North Dakota will increase patrols from May 1 through June 2 as part of the Click It or Ticket campaign, focusing on enforcing North Dakota's seat belt law.

Seat belts are the single most effective safety device to prevent death and injury in a traffic crash. Unbelted fatal crashes in North Dakota occur most often on rural roads and during weekend (Friday and Saturday) nights according to the state's most recent data. Many of these fatalities involve males, who made up 79 percent of the unbelted traffic deaths over the past five years (2019-2023).

North Dakota's seat belt law is now a primary enforcement law meaning drivers can be stopped and cited solely for not wearing a seat belt. The law mandates that

all occupants, regardless of seating position, must be buckled up or in the appropriate child restraint.

Surrey Police Chief Kevin Howe reminds drivers, "One click can change everything. You never know which drive might be the one that changes your life."

Seat belts are proven to significantly reduce the risk of serious injury or death in a crash. Data shows that belted occupants are more likely to escape crashes with minor or no injuries, while those unbelted face a much higher risk.

This campaign is part of the Vision Zero strategy to eliminate fatalities and serious injuries on North Dakota roadways.

### Public Notice from the Rolette County Sheriff's Office

With warm weather arriving, the Rolette County Sheriff's Office has seen a significant increase in the use of UTVs, side-by-sides, four-wheelers, and off-highway motorcycles operating in ditches and on public roadways. We've also received numerous complaints regarding illegal activities including DUI, trespassing, fence cutting, and destruction of private property and fields.

We want our residents to know that we are aware of these issues and are stepping up enforcement efforts immediately. Violations of these laws will result in citations or criminal charges as appropriate.

We urge all riders to familiarize themselves with the North Dakota Century Code:

- **NDCC 39-29-09** – Operation of off-highway vehicles, including restrictions on where they may be driven and requirements such as lights and proper behavior
- **NDCC 39-29-09.1** – Required equipment for operation on paved or loose surface roads
- **NDCC 39-29-10** – Restrictions for operators under 16 years of age
- **NDCC 39-29-11 & 12** – Enforcement and penalties for violations

Among other provisions, the law prohibits:

- Operating on paved highways unless the vehicle is registered and meets equipment standards
- Driving under the influence (DUI)
- Trespassing on posted private property or cutting fences
- Operating recklessly or damaging agricultural land

We encourage everyone to ride responsibly, respect property rights, and help keep our county safe and enjoyable for all residents and landowners.
