Multiple Prime Bids shall separately represent General, Mechanical, and Electrical Construction. Bids shall be received at Belcourt School District #7, Attn: Duane Poltra, Business Manager 1207 William Hardesty St. Belcourt, ND 58316 until Thursday, June 5th at 1:00 PM. Central Time at which time qualified submittals will be publicly opened and read.

The Base Bid building plan is 11,200 s.f., Add Alternate 1 increase the size to 17,200 s.f., and Add Alternate 2 increases the building to 23,200 s.f. Work represented includes but is not limited to associated utilities, concrete foundation and slabs, pre-engineered metal building, overhead doors and operators, fire suppression system, heating, floor drains, electrical systems, and lighting.
