 b. Subsequent offenses. Any person who shall vio-late any provision of this division or any regulation, rule, or order made hereunder within 24 months after comnitting a previous violation

· For a second offense a fine of \$250.00

 For a third offense a fine of \$500.00 For a fourth offense a fine of \$500.00

c. Each and every day that a violation occurs, continues and/or remains present constitutes a separate of fense

d. The City, in addition to the above mo penalty and special charges may from time to time seel and obtain, and the court may order,

temporary and/or permanent injunctive relief, abate ment, and such other legal and/or equitable relief, remedies, judgments, and/or orders of the court against any person and/or property as the court may, from time to time, deem necessary, appropriate and/or desirable to effectuate the intent of this division and the public good, peace, order, welfare, and/or safety.
