Foughty as Judge of the District Court in the Northeast Judicial District, effective September 30, 2025. There-fore, under N.D.C.C. § 27-05-02.1, a vacancy in the office of district judge will be created upon Judge Foughty's retirement

[¶2] Section 27-05-02.1, N.D.C.C., requires the Supreme Court to determine whether the judgeship is necessary for effective judicial administration in the Northeast Judicial District or whether the judgeship may be transferred. Fact brief looks at landlord desposit requirements

Are landlords in North Dakota required to return security deposits within 30 days of a tenant moving out? Yes

In North Dakota, landlords are required by law to return a tenant's security deposit within 30 days of the lease ending or the tenant moving out The landlord must also provide an itemized list of any deductions made from the deposit within that same 30day period, according to the North Dakota Attorney General's Tenants Rights resource. Deductions can only be made for damages beyond normal wear and tear or for unpaid rent and cleaning services. The law is designed to ensure that tenants are treated fairly and receive either their full deposit back or a clear explanation of any charges. If the landlord fails to return the deposit or provide the required itemized list within 30 days, the tenant has legal grounds to seek the return of the deposit. Legal timeframes vary by state, from 60 days in Alabama to two weeks in South Dakota and other states. This fact brief is responsive to conversations such as this one.
