The immune system overreacts to a harmless substance (allergen), producing IgE antibodies that trigger mast cells to release histamine and other chemicals. This causes a range of symptoms from localized effects like itchy skin and a stuffy nose to full-body reactions called anaphylaxis, characterized by swelling, difficulty breathing, and a dangerous drop in

blood pressure.

1. The Immune System's Mistake
Allergen detection: Your immune
system mistakenly identifies a harmless substance, such as pollen, a food, or medication, as a threat. IgE antibody production: It produces Immuno-globulin E (IgE) antibodies specifically designed tò rećognize this allergen.

2. <u>The Chemical Cascade</u> Sensitized mast cells: IgE antibodies attach to immune cells called mast cells, making them "sensitized". Histamine release: The next time you encounter the allergen, the IgE antibodies signal the mast cells to release chemicals like histamine.

. The Resulting Symptoms Histamine and other inflammatory chemicals cause various effects throughout the body, depending on the allergen and how it entered the body. **Skin:** Itching, redness, hives, or swelling of the lips and face. Respiratory system: Stuffy nose, sneezing, coughing, wheezing, and difficulty breathing. Circulatory system: A sudden drop in blood pressure (hypotension), a weak pulse, dizziness, and even loss of consciousness. Digestive system: Nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, or diarrhea.

4. Severe Allergic Reaction (Anaphylaxis) Anaphylaxis is a severe, life-threatening reaction where the body's immune response becomes widespread. Symptoms can develop rapidly and include throat closing, chest tightness, confusion, a feeling of impending doom, and a blueish tint to the skin from a lack of oxygen. Anaphylaxis requires immediate medical attention, according to the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America | AAFA.
