(Looking back over past Ozone issues by Linda Sherman)

75 years ago – Dec 14, 1950

A public hearing granted to J. J. Seher, suspended superintendent of the Steele Public School, will be held Friday, Dec. 15th at the Steele community building, open to the public. Seher is charged with several things, including the refusal to carry out board orders, and inciting rebellion among teachers and pupils of the local school against members of the school board. Mr. Seher claims the charges are unfounded and says that he will carry his case into the courts if not vindicated at the public school board hearing held here tomorrow.

The welfare committee of the North Dakota Educational Association directed that three association members make an investigation of a school row at Steele. The committee's action in ordering an NDEA investigation of affairs at Steele was taken on the recommendation of the association's executive secretary after he had made a preliminary investigation.

Steele has been made a flag stop for Northern Pacific Fast Trains No. 1 and 2 to allow passengers to depart from and board the train to all destinations where the service is rendered. The Public Service Commission concluded that stopping Trains No. 1 and 2 on flag at Steele allows a sufficient length of time to receive and let off passengers with safety. Steele has been a regular stop for all passenger trains of the railroad for a year or so. When it becomes a flag stop for Trains 1 and 2, Steele will be a regular stop only for Trains 3 and 4, known as the "Local."

C. G. Foye, local postmaster, announces that the windows of the Steele post office will be open to the public on Saturday afternoons, Dec. 16 and 23, to serve them better during the Christmas holiday rush season.
