ORDINANCE NO. 24 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REENACT ARTICLE 3 CHAPTER 15 PERTAINING TO DISORDERLY CONDUCT WITHIN THE CITY OF DAWSON

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAWSON, NORTH DAKOTA

ARTICLE 3 - Offences Against Public Order, Health, Safty, and Sen-<u>sibilities</u>

Division 1. Disorderly Conduct 15.0301 Disorderly Conduct

- 1. An individual is guilty of violating the ordinances of this City, if with intent to harass, annoy or alarm another person or in reckless disregard of the fact that another is harassed, annoyed or alarmed by the individual's behavior, the individual:
- a. Engages in fighting or in violent, tumultuous or threatening behavior;
 b. Makes unreasonable noise;
- c. In a public place, uses abusive or obscene language, or makes an
- obscene gesture; d. Obstructs vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or the use of public facility; e. Persistently follows a person in
- or about a public place or places; f. While loitering in a public place for the purpose of soliciting sexual
- contact, the individual solicits such contact; g. Creates a hazardous, physically offensive, or seriously alarming condition by any act that serves no
- legitimate purpose;
 h. Engages in harassing conduct
 by means of intrusive or unwanted acts, words, or gestures that are acts, words, or gestures that are intended to adversely affect the safety, security or privacy of another person. (Source: North Dakota Century Code Section 12.1-31-01); or g. Uses a fixed optical device that enhances or records a visual occurrence which captures a visual through

rence which captures a view through any window of another person's property; or uses a surveillance camers to capture an image from the dwelling or accessory structure of another person; however, an individual using a surveillance camera has seven days from notice by law enforcement officer to direct or sheild the camera so as to not capture an image from another person's dwelling or accessory struture before there is an offense. This section does not apply to constitutionally protected activity. If an individual claims to have engaged in a constitutionally protected activity, the court shall determine the validity of the claim as a matter of law and, if found valid shall exclude evidence of the activity.


