

PUBLIC HEARING

The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT) is hosting public hearings Monday July 27th, 2026 and Tuesday July 28th, 2026, from 5 to 7 p.m. Central Time to discuss proposed improvements to US Highway 52, from Minot (approximately 2.3 miles west of Junction 79th Ave SE) to Voltaire.

The hearings will be held at the Sleep Inn and Suites, Theater Room, 2400 10th Street SW in Minot, ND on July 27th, and Velva City Hall, 101 1st St W in Velva, ND on July 28th. The same materials will be presented at each hearing. There will be an open house format with a formal presentation at 5:30 to 6:00 p.m.

The project is studying the expansion of US Highway 52 from a two-lane highway to a four-lane highway.

Representatives from the NDDOT and Ulteig will be on hand to answer questions and discuss concerns.

A pre-recorded presentation and other materials will be available on the NDDOT website at www.dot.nd.gov/public-input. The pre-recorded presentation will be published on July 27th.
