### CITY OF HAZELTON SPECIAL MEETING

NOVEMBER 21, 2025 @ 8:30 AM  
CITY HALL (MAIN STREET)

Commissioners present: Justin Long, Gloria Pederson, Joshua Malard, Mark Long and Brady Reich. City Auditor and City Maintenance also present.

CALL TO ORDER by Josh Malard at 8:30 AM

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Visitors in attendance were Bryce Sayler, Grant Dockter, Tom Shea and William Langenfelder with Trash LLC, Lance Selzer with ECO Sanitation and Richard Mower with Waste Management.

#### AGENDA:

Street project. Grant provided the board with an updated map with Moore Engineering's recommendations. There is a section of Western that is the state's property. Moore Engineering will work with the state to determine how to proceed. North Cook Ave, Kirk St, Cottage St and South Western Ave are set to be mill sections. They are recommending 4 places for valley gutter to help with the flow of water. They plan to reach out at the Catholic Church in regard to their parking lot. Grant inquired

if the school is still interested. Josh said he would touch base with school staff and get back to Grant. Grant asked about the parking spot by 331 Kellas, the board informed him that that is private to the owner. Terry asked if it would be a possibility to make the corner of Hazel Ave and Main ST wider; as well as the road continuing to the east. Grant said they would keep it in mind as the project progresses. The drainage problem on the corner of Center/Hazel was discussed. Moore Engineering is uncertain at this time what would be the best solution. Possibility is to send the water to the west, grading the whole block on Hazel and add a culvert in the driveway or flatten out the ditch so the water doesn't sit in the corner. The dirt road section on Shobert was talked about. The drainage for this section is not adequate so the board thinks it might be a good idea to eliminate paving this section. Grant said adding gravel could be an option too. Special assessment method was talked about. We will need a special assessment committee to be formed. The committee consists of 3 people that live in the city limits but are not on the commission board. They should be detail oriented,

pretty well acquainted to the city and will meet with Moore Engineering 2/3 times. Special assessments can be formulated by Front Footage (FF), Square Footage (SF) or by Unit.

Garbage bids. Brady asked ECO to clarify his fees for cleanup. Lance said if the items they pick up during city cleanup go to Hazelton's landfill, there is no additional charge. But if he takes items to Bismarck, there would be. Trash LLC was asked to clarify if their fee table changed according to where the items ended up going and William said no it doesn't. Trash LLC and Eco Sanitation were very close with their bids. Some comments the board members made were Trash LLC purchases locally and that could make up the difference between the bids since the purchases bring in tax revenue and Trash LLC not charging any extra fees for city cleanup also makes up the difference. Gloria recommended going with Trash LLC. Roll call vote to award Trash LLC the garbage hauling contract at a three-year term. Unanimous ayes.

Justin motioned to adjourn at 9:18 AM and Gloria seconded. All ayes.

all scorers in the half with 10 points.

CS turned three steals into three quick field goals to start the second half, and Berger's lay-up off a steal capped a 9-0 run that pushed the lead to 40-12 with 6:15 left in the period. After Laura Haak put in a field goal for SZ on the next trip, Boeshans put back an offensive rebound for a score, and later, she scored on a fast break off an assist from Erhardt to push the margin to 30 points (44-14). Erhardt's put-back on midway through the quarter gave CS its biggest lead (46-14) of the game, and the Wildcats took a 50-21 advantage into the fourth quarter.

CS played mostly reserves in the final period, and Annabelle Cason's three-pointer with just over three minutes remaining gave the Wildcats a 56-25 lead, which started the continuous clock (30-point margin in 4th quarter) the rest of the way.

Both teams shot just 33% from the field, but CS attempted 58 shots, converting 19 of them, with the tally including five three-pointers, while SZ missed all three of its attempts from behind the arc, and hit on 12 of 36 shots from the field overall. CS committed 20 turnovers, but the Wildcats converted 13 of 22 free throws and held a 40-

31 advantage in rebounds, including an 18-5 margin on the offensive glass. SZ hit on just four of 17 free throws and turned the ball over 34 times in the game.

Madison Van Beek grabbed five rebounds and led SZ with seven points, while R. Haak (7 rebounds) and Larson (3 rebounds) scored five points each, and L. Haak (6 rebounds, 4 assists) and Megan Van Beek (5 rebounds, 3 steals) netted four points a piece for the Lady Clippers. Violet Haak added two points, and Jozlyn Volk hit a free throw and dished out two assists for SZ.

Erhardt and Boeshans each scored a game-high 11 points, while Hendrickson finished with 10 points, and Berger netted eight points for CS. Brown, Cason and Briella Hintz added seven, six and three points, respectively, to complete the scoring for the Wildcats. Individual statistics for CS, other than scoring, were not available.
