She received quotes ranging from 3.75 to 7.50 percent. The board asked Terry to reach out to Bank of Hazelton to see if they would match the lowest rate. If Bank of Hazelton does not match, the City will go with the lowest rate. Discussion was held on what the city should bid on this item. The board decided no more than \$20,000 including the fees that may be involved. Brady motioned to approve putting a bid of no more than \$20,000 on the item and Mark seconded. All ayes.

City Attorney. Terry sent out request for qualifications for a city attorney to several law offices. She received one response from Ohnstad Twitchell. The board asked Terry to reach out to more law offices in the hopes to get more responses.

Contract with League of Cities.

The city was presented a contract to work with Abby Salinas to update the bank reconciliations, fund accounting procedures, update the chart of accounts and record organization. The contract covers Abby's mileage at the state rate, hotel coverage, per diem and her hourly rate. The city will cover per diem of the meals associated with the timeframe she is here and her hotel when overnight is required. The initial week is 16 hours with 8 hours max per week thereafter. Contract ends April 30, 2026 or when work is completed. She will have access to the BMS cloud network as read only in the hopes to keep the time she needs to be here to a minimum. Justin motioned to approve the agreement and Mark seconded. All ayes.
