

Tigers win a clincher

The New England boys basketball team played two jamboree games during the holiday break, winning a nail-biter game against Kidder County, then dropping the second game to Park River/Fordville-Lankin. A one-point 54-53 win over Kidder County Dec. 29 at Bismarck State College came down to the last seconds, when senior Jordan Jung hit the go-ahead basket with just six seconds ticking away on the clock. When the Tigers were down by four points earlier in the final quarter, Jung hit a three-pointer, then hit another shot to momentarily put the Tigers ahead. Jung scored 20 points in the game, including 12 points beyond the arc. That came after a quiet first quarter, with the Tigers only scoring four points in the entire quarter before coming alive the second quarter, with Jung hitting two treys in that quarter.

Eighth-grader Breken Binstock helped seal the game, with two treys in the fourth quarter for 12 total points in the game to join Jung in double digits. While the Tigers found a win in the fourth quarter against Kidder County, the final quarter turned the tide against the Tigers in the 36-45 loss to Park River/Fordville-Lankin Dec. 30 at United Tribes Technical College.

Jung again led his team with 18 points, but the Tigers only put six points on the scoreboard the fourth quarter to fall behind Park River. The Tigers lost steam after holding Park River to just two points in the first quarter, as Jung sank two treys in that quarter for the Tiger lead. The Tigers return home on Saturday, Jan. 17, to face Central McLean.
