through our schools to provide programs that teach about addictions and making positive choices.

Q.. What are the greatest challenges related to law enforcement in Hettinger County and how do you expect to meet those challenges?

A. Response time for calls has always been a challenge, as we cover approximately 1,136 square miles. Communicating with an individual by contacting them and letting them know we are on the way helps to give reassurance of when we will arrive. Also, we work with our

other law enforcement agencies and ask for assistance if they may be closer to the call.

Q. What traits or experiences make you the best candidate for sheriff?

A. Having over 20 years of experience, I have encountered many situations. I tend to be calm when facing difficult situations and try to use common sense in making decisions.

Working with other law enforcement through different boards and committees in which I have been involved has given me the ability to obtain knowledge to make me a

better leader.

Q. Why are you seeking the office of sheriff in this election cycle?

A. I believe the citizens of Hettinger County deserve to have someone who is consistent and knows what is happening in their communities. Someone who is open to new ideas and supports those on the team to better their careers. Someone who works alongside our ambulance services and volunteer fire departments who provide for our citizens. Someone who is mindful of a budget and does not take lightly who

provides for our funding. Someone who is thankful for living in a county that backs law enforcement and is willing to assist when we need help.

It has been a true honor to serve and protect Hettinger County for the past 20 years. I would appreciate the opportunity to continue serving as sheriff for the next four years.

Legislators attend meet and greet

A meet and greet was held in the Regent Senior Center April 12. Eleven Republican and Democrat legislators and those who wished to become a legislator were invited to attend and share their views and goals. Five legislators were present, along with two who were endorsed.

Hettinger County is divided into two political districts, Districts 31 and District 39. Marlene Kouba opened the session by showing a map of Hettinger County and how it

is divided. She also showed a map of the districts and the large territory they cover.

Among the candidates for two House seats, the top two in the June election will move forward to the general election in November. The four District 31 House candidates are Rep. Karen Rohr, Mandan, Rep. Dawson Holle, Mandan, Jim Schmidt, Huff, and Kevin Remington, Regent.

Representing District 39 at this session were Sen. Greg Kessel of Belfield and

Rep. Keith Kempenich of Bowman.

For the District 31 N.D. Senate seat, there was Sen. Don Schaible of Mott.

The candidates were asked to speak about their background and their positions on various topics, such as education, agriculture, energy, tax issues, environment, data centers and more.

One brought up the facts about low voter turnout during past elections.

Numerous questions were asked by those in attendance.

ABBREVIATED NOTICE OF INTENT TO REVISE ADMINISTRATIVE RULES RELATING TO MODIFIED PUBLIC SCHOOL CALENDAR

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (NDDPI) will hold a public hearing to address proposed changes of N.D. Admin. Code 67-15, Modified Public School Calendar; at 9:30 AM on Thursday, June 4, 2026, in the Peace Garden Room at the State Capitol, 600 E. Boulevard Ave., Bismarck, ND 58505.

The purpose of the proposed changes is to amend 67-15-02, Reconfiguration of Instructional Days, to rename the chapter "Four-Day School Week" and to update the criteria for which a school district can be approved the operate under a four-day school week. The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.
