LaMoure/Litchville-Marion/Edgeley Varsity Loboes Earn Walk-Off Win Over Carrington Varsity Cardinals

It came down to the wire on Monday at LaMoure, as LLME grabbed the victory in walk-off fashion, 6-5, over Carrington Varsity Cardinals. The game was tied at five in the bottom of the eighth when Mason Warcken singled, scoring one run.

Carrington got on the board in the first inning after Taylen Mehring singled, scoring one run.

In the bottom of the first inning, LLME went back into the lead after Colby Thielges singled, Ross Fredenburg doubled to center field, and Warcken singled to center field, each scoring one run.

The Loboes added zero runs in the third. Grayson Mattson walked, making the score 4-1.

Carrington took the lead in the top of the sixth. Isaiah Oatis singled, scoring three runs, to give Carrington Varsity Cardinals the leg up, 5-4.

Thielges lined into a fielder's choice, which helped the Loboes tie the game at five in the bottom of the sixth.

Easton Thielges earned the win for LLME. The righty gave up one hit and zero runs over two and one-third innings, striking out five and walking none. Gunner Thielges stepped on the mound first for the Loboes. The pitcher surrendered six hits and four runs (two earned) over five and two-thirds innings, striking out six and walking three. Jacob Boeshans led things off on the mound for Carrington. The starting pitcher surrendered eight hits and six runs (four earned) over seven innings, striking out nine and walking three.

LLME amassed 10 hits in the game. Warcken drove the middle of the lineup, leading LLME with two runs batted in. The cleanup hitter went 2-for-3 on the day. Leadoff hitter Thielges led the Loboes with three hits in five at bats. Thielges and Fredenburg each collected multiple hits for
