OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE LAMOURE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING-Tuesday, June 2nd, 2026

At 8:30 am Chairman Bruce Klein called the meeting to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and roll call. Commissioners present: Robert Flath, Wayne Wald, Jason Weigel and Keith Heidinger. Also present in person were: Jan Hamlin, Auditor; Fallon Kelly, States Attorney; Darrick Nitschke, Highway Superintendent; and Art Hagebock, LaMoure County Chronicle. Virtual was Kimberly Robbins.

Chairman Klein called for additions to the agenda. The addition was adding a Gaming Site Authorization. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the agenda with the addition, seconded by Comm Wald. All voting aye, motion carried.

The May 19th minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Comm Wald to approve the minutes presented, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried.

Chairman Klein called for public comment; no comment.

Road Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke reported the crew is finishing the Jud Road and two more lifts of gravel will be put in place. Darrick is working on getting a value for the grinder so it could be sold or traded in. Once he has the value, he will bring it to the next commission meeting. Darrick presented a driveway application for Mike Vogel to add a new field access off of CR 35 approximately 1/3 mile west of intersection CR 35 and 104th Ave SE. Mike will be responsible for expenses. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the permit for the approach, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried. The load restriction came off the county gravel roads on May 26. Two employees have been hired for the summer.

DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins, reported on the State Emergency Communication Center (SECC) rates. The rate will remain at \$1.59 per line for 2027-2029. Local residents are charged \$2.00 per month per landline or cell phone. After state fees, the county receives \$1.37 then pays the SECC the \$1.59 per line. Kimberly informed the commission that LaMoure County will not transition to Statewide Interoperability Radio Network (SIREN) in 2026. The Skywarn Training hoses in Kulm was good. There were eight in attendance with three law enforcement. The Storm Shelter will be at Memorial Park next Tuesday.

Comm Heidinger brought to the board the need for improvements and updates for the museum buildings. The museum and school house need shingles and the quote came in at \$40,385. The museum also needs soffit which had a quote of \$1,200. The question is who pays for the maintenance on these buildings. The museum only gets .25 mills, donations and \$5,000 per year from the county. Some board members feel the museum buildings are county. The State's Attorney will look over the requirements for using Weaver Trust funds. The current balance in that account is \$116,472.32. The museum is open Saturdays and Sundays 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

Another letter was received from RESCOM with a proposed tower project. North Dakota Association of Counties has sent a check for the reimbursement of the 2025 Workers Comp Premium Dividend Credit. This payment includes a Workers' Comp Safety and SMP discount earned through Jennifer McDonald-Hogan's diligent oversight of our workplace safety policies.

Angela reported that our current software CPT and appraisal software CAMA are not communicating. She is working with both vendors to resolve this issue. The final report from CAMA at this time is show sales ratio of residential at 81.7% and commercial at 90%. Agricultural should be in state compliance but more information is needed. Dave Muske inquired why two similar parcels have an approximate \$500 difference. The one he pays more on has less acreage but has a shed and old house. The Tax Equalization Office will work with Dave and go out and reassess his property. Comm Weigel made a motion to recess the County Tax Equalization Meeting at 10:53 a.m. and continue it at the next commissioner meeting on June 16, seconded by Comm Wald. All voting aye, motion carried.

Karen Hinch joined the meeting via Zoom to review the school board's proposed guardrails. She summarized the board members' ideas and values, recommending that the board narrow the list to five core guardrails. Karen explained that the guardrails are intended to serve as guiding principles to help hold the board accountable to its governance role rather than as measurable goals. She recommended reviewing the guardrails twice per year to refresh understanding and clarify the board's responsibilities within the district. The board agreed on five baseline guardrails, which Karen will finalize and present at next month's meeting for formal introduction and adoption.

Staffing Update

Mr. Carlson reported that Lexi Siedschlag has been hired for the Assistant Cook position. She will complete training over the summer and begin her regular duties in mid-August.

The district is currently advertising for a paraprofessional position following Grace Daugherty's resignation. Ms. Daugherty will be moving to Litchville-Marion to complete her student teaching in the English Department.

Mr. Carlson also reported that Roxanne Wolding will serve as the district's Technology Coordinator through a contract with EduTech at a cost of \$2,000 per month. Her responsibilities will include assisting with Infinite Campus, new computer setup, and general technology support.

Support staff contracts have been distributed and are due back by June 29th.

The district is also evaluating transportation staffing needs, including the possibility of hiring an additional bus driver or adjusting Brian Heyd's contract to a route-based structure rather than a full-time position.

Mr. Carlson discussed the potential implementation of a tuition levy to help offset district tuition expenses. These costs may include placements in state programs such as Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch or Prairie St. John's, as well as tuition for courses provided through the Center for Distance Education when the district is unable to offer certain classes internally, such as business education.

Mr. Carlson confirmed the district will proceed with purchasing the Magellan bus, with payment split across two fiscal years. The bus will be assigned to Luke's route, Luke's current bus will become a substitute bus, and Bus #6 will be retired to improve fleet reliability.

Mr. Carlson also discussed a potential opportunity to purchase a coach bus from Joe Neis of Edgeley for \$40,000. The bus is currently undergoing inspection and updates in Minneapolis and has been reported to be in excellent condition. Before deciding, the district will determine the value of both the current coach bus and the potential replacement, as only one coach bus is needed. Mr. Carlson plans to inspect the bus when it returns on June 23.

Trista Shockman made a motion to approve the second reading of policy changes. Jana Anderson seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.
