ORDINANCE NO. 464

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BEULAH, MERCER COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA.

VIOLATIONS

6.1 PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

1. Violation of the provisions of this ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements, including violations on conditions and safeguards established in connection with grants or variances or conditional uses, shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance of fails to comply with any

of its requirements shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding \$1,500 or by imprisonment not to exceed 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment for each such offense, and in addition shall pay costs and expenses involved in the case. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.


2. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City of Beulah from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.
