CITY OF GOLDEN VALLEY NOTICE OF ORDINANCE CHANGES

Please be advised the City of Golden Valley has amended the following ordinances to include fees and potential fines and follows:

Section 9.2 in Article 1, Chapter VI of the Ordinances of the City of Golden Valley be amended to read as follows:

9.2 PERMITS

Building Permit

Add the following:

5. In the event construction has commenced prior to obtaining a building permit the governing body shall assess a \$250 fee for a late application and all work shall immediately halt until such time the applicant receives a building permit from the governing body. The governing body may waive some or all of the fee collected for a late permit application for good cause shown.

AND:

Be it hereby ordained by the City Council of the City of Golden Valley that Section 1.0202 in Article 1, Chapter I of the Ordinances of the City

of Golden Valley be amended to read as follows:

1.0202 Special Meetings.

Special meetings may be called at any time by the mayor or two members of the governing body to consider matters mentioned in the call of such meetings. Notice of any special meeting shall be given to each member of the governing body at least three hours before the time of the meeting.

In the event that a special meeting is requested by a citizen of the community or business within the community to obtain a permit of any kind that citizen or business must pay a fee of \$250 to the City Auditor at the time request is made. The City Auditor will then attempt to schedule a meeting as soon as practicable. If a meeting cannot be scheduled, the City Auditor shall return the fee collected. The governing body may waive some or all of the fee collected at the special meeting for good cause shown.

AND:

Floodplain Management.

SECTION 6.0

VIOLATIONS

6.1 PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

(1) Violation of the provisions of this ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements, including violations on conditions and safeguards established in connection with grants or variances or conditional uses, shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500 or by imprisonment not to exceed 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment for each such offense, and in addition shall pay costs and expenses involved in the case. Each day such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.
