Beulah Bay Rec Area #2 is required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the month of May 2026 we did not complete all microbiological monitoring or testing and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

A minimum of one (1) acceptable sample was to be submitted to a certified laboratory for microbiological analysis. Records show zero (0) acceptable samples were submitted for the month of May 2026.

Beulah Bay Rec Area #2 regrets that this

error in meeting monitoring requirements occurred. It is recognized that a complete monitoring program is of great value in making certain that safe drinking water is provided to all consumers. Steps have been taken to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.
