(MHA Nation) - North East Segment, in partnership with Elbowoods Memorial Health Center, is developing a new healthcare facility to serve the Parshall community and surrounding region. This project strengthens access to high-quality, culturally aligned medical care and supports the Tribe's long-term goals of enhancing health services and community wellbeing. The Elbowoods Memorial Health Center / North East Segment is seeking proposals from qualified firms to provide Construction Manager at Risk (CMaR) services for the Parshall Field Clinic. The selected firm will work collaboratively with the Owner and design team to support pre-construction planning, cost estimating, constructability reviews, scheduling, procurement, and overall construction management to ensure the project is delivered on time, aligned with the approved program, and compliant with applicable Tribal and healthcare facility standards.

Project Overview
The Parshall Field Clinic consists of a new, approximately 14,000-square-foot ambulatory healthcare facility consolidating key services such as Primary Care, Dental, Pharmacy, Optometry, Behavioral Health, Imaging, Laboratory, Administrative areas, and Staff Support. The project also includes associated sitework, parking, circulation, utility connections, geothermal integration, and required coordination with Tribal and regional agencies. Final scope and sequencing will be refined during pre-construction in partnership with the selected CMaR. TAT Procurement Policies will be followed to ensure both tribal and federal procurement policies are being met. The project will be funded by IHS SAP Grant and 3rd party federal revenue monies.

Scope of Services
The selected Construction Manager at Risk (CMaR) shall provide full pre-construction, construction, and post-construction services to support successful delivery of the project. March 2, 2026
Mayor Thiesen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Roll call was taken and the following members were present: S Fennewald, J Hix, T Wheeler, and B Morgan (via phone). Absent: R Napora.
Also present: Chief Howe, C Oldenburg, C Berger, E Westman, and a few residents.

The pledge was recited. The agenda was presented. Wheeler/Fennewald MSP to approve the agenda adding a CVMA Public Appearance, addressing costs for street lighting, and discussing Sales Tax dedication within the regular part of business. Mayor Thiesen closed the Regular meeting at 7:04 p.m. and opened Public Hearing. First addressing the Lead/Copper Rule. Efforts will be made in the upcoming months to collect inventory inside of residential homes. Second part of the hearing was to gather input on whether to tag a sales tax percent for use of equipment and/or to put a measure on the ballot. Suggestions were made to cap the purchase limit or include but only go up to a percent. The Hearing was closed at 7:36 p.m. and the Regular meeting was reopened. Monthly minutes were provided. Fennewald/Hix MSP to approve the February Regular and Special meeting minute sets. Monthly financial reports were provided. Bills for street lighting were questioned, being required to be paid by the General fund.

Gantzer/Wheeler MS to approve the February Financial Reports, Payroll Totals, and Claims to be paid. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Gantzer, Wheeler, Morgan, Fennewald, and Hix; Nays: None. A local vet chapter commander came before the members and talked towards details of holding a derby. Gantzer/Hix MS to approve CVMA hold a Demolition Derby on June 6th, 2026, provided that the group obtains event insurance, law enforcement coverage, and approval from the Fire District waiving any permit fees. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Gantzer, Hix, Wheeler, Fennewald, and Morgan; Nays: None. Chapter 19 Floodplain revisions up for 2nd read. Fennewald/Gantzer MS to approve Final Reading of Amendment Chapter 19 Flood Damage Prevention. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Fennewald, Gantzer, Morgan, and Hix; Nays: None. Gantzer/Wheeler MS to approve raising Chief Howe's wage to \$34.50 per hour. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Gantzer, Wheeler, Morgan, Fennewald, and Hix; Nays: None. A quote was provided for re-

cent lift repairs. Gantzer/Wheeler MSP to approve ND Sewage Pump and Lift's pump repairs completed at the SE Lift Station. Fennewald/Gantzer MS to approve Eric Westman receive a 2 % COL raise based on his starting wage backdated to January 1st. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Fennewald, Gantzer, Wheeler, Morgan, and Hix; Nays: None. Fennewald/Wheeler MS to approve Eric Westman receive a raise of \$50 per hour. Motion passed unanimously on the following vote: Ayes: Fennewald, Wheeler, Gantzer, Morgan, and Hix; Nays: None. Snow removal was requested for a walking path in Silver Springs. The Peace Officer Retirement rate was updated within the employee benefits section of the personnel policy. Fennewald/Hix MSP to accept the 2026 Ward County Emergency Operations Plan. April 6th will be Surrey's Tax Equalization meeting at 6:00 p.m., followed by Regular meeting at 7:00 p.m., and anyone wanting to have their names printed on the ballot will need their petitions turned in by 4:00 p.m. that day. Further direction was provided to prepare a sales tax measure for April's meeting utilizing up to 1% for equipment. Meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
