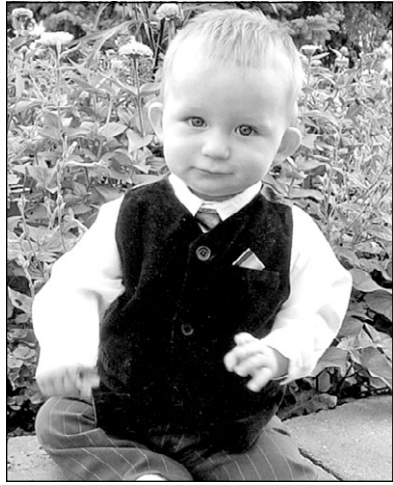
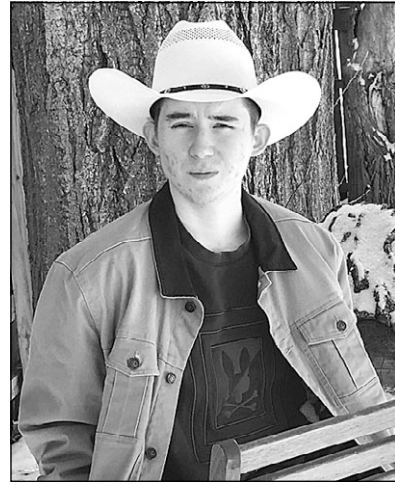

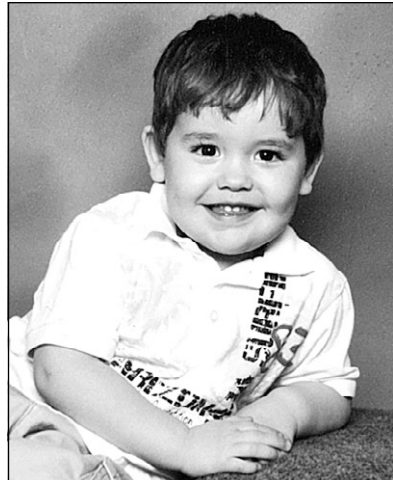

## New Ballot Measure Guide To Be Sent To Voters Ahead Of Primary Election

The North Dakota Office of the Secretary of State will be mailing out a pamphlet with information regarding statewide Measure #1 which will appear on the June 9, 2026, Primary Election ballot. The ballot measure guide will be mailed Friday, April 24, 2026, to the households of 450,000 active North Dakota voters. An active voter is a person who has voted in a North Dakota election in the last four years. The ballot measure guide will also be posted at all voting locations and on the North Dakota Secretary of State website.

The new ballot measure guide was mandated by the North Dakota Legislature in 2025 as a result of the passage of Senate Bill 2230 which instructs the Office of the Secretary of State to create and mail out information regarding statewide ballot questions 45-days prior to a statewide election. This guide includes:

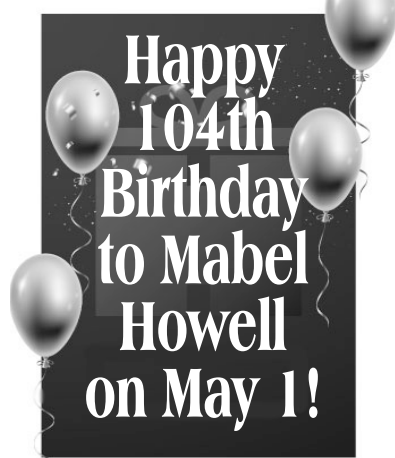
- An objective summary of the measure.
- The anticipated fiscal impact of the measure.
- Whether the measure was approved by the legislature or originated as an initiated or referred petition.
- An objective analysis of a vote in favor and a vote opposed.

"The next election is always the most important election. Our office is a resource for voters seeking a

sample ballot, polling location information, and information about the security, accuracy, and timeliness of North Dakota's election process," North Dakota Secretary of State Michael Howe said. "The new ballot measure guide provides a way for voters to learn more about what will be on their ballot during this June's Primary Election."

The North Dakota Office of the Secretary of State will also provide a ballot measure guide before the November 3, 2026, General Election.

## Series Of Summer Day Camps Registration Opens May 1

The North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department will open registration on May 1, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. for its popular Summer Day Camp series, offering numerous opportunities for kids across the state to explore, learn and connect with the outdoors.

This year marks a significant expansion of the program, growing from two locations to five participating parks. In addition to Lake Metigoshe State Park and Turtle River State Park, which have hosted camps for several years, new locations include Fort Abraham Lincoln State Park, Icelandic State Park, and Pembina Gorge State Park.

The day camps offer a variety of sessions with age-appropriate programming. They are designed to engage participants in hands-on learning experiences that highlight environmental education, historical and cultural understanding, and outdoor recreational skills. Campers will participate in activities such as hiking, nature exploration and interactive history-based programming

tailored to each park's unique landscape and story.

Specific schedules, themes, age ranges and links to register can be found on the ND Parks and Recreation website. Interested families are encouraged to register early, as space is limited.

"Day camps are one of the most powerful ways we connect kids to the outdoors," said North Dakota Parks and Recreation Education and Programs Chief Josh Steffan. "These experiences go beyond the classroom by giving participants the chance to learn by doing, whether that's exploring a trail, building outdoor skills, or discovering the history of the land firsthand. Hands-on learning in the outdoors gives kids the opportunity to build confidence, curiosity, and a real connection to the world around them."

The mission of the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department is to enrich generations through experiences that connect people and places.
