## Goodrich City Ordinance Changes for Animals and Fowl

Chapter 11  
Animals and Fowl  
ARTICLE 1- General Regulations  
11.0101- Abuse and Cruelty-Penalty  
No person shall at any time treat any animal in an abusive or cruel manner. Any person that inhumanely beats, underfeeds, drowns, overloads or abandons an animal in any way shall be deemed guilty of an offense for which the maximum penalty shall be a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or thirty (30) days imprisonment or both. N.D.C.C. §§ 36-21.2-02 and 36-21.2-03.

11.0102- Dangerous Animals Defined; Designated

11.0103- Dangerous Animal Permit Required to be Issued

An initial permit of one hundred and fifty (\$150.00) dollars will be required with an annual renewal fee of twenty-five (\$25.00).

11.0104- Dangerous Animal Permit Revocation

Proof of humane euthanasia by a licensed veterinarian or rehoming must be

provided to the Council within three (3) days of revocation. In the event the permit is canceled,

revoked, or nonrenewed and owner or keeper fails to provide proof of rehoming or humane

euthanasia by a licensed veterinarian within three (3) days, owner will be guilty of a violation of

this article, for which a fine of up to

two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars per day will be imposed until proof is provided.

Penalty- Any citizen in violation of this ordinance, will receive a notice of violation with a 7 day

grace period to butcher, rehome or humanely euthanize their livestock. On day eight (8) a penalty of twenty-five (25) dollars per remaining animal will be imposed per day. At the end of 30 days, any and all remaining prohibited animals will be confiscated or humanely euthanized by law enforcement at the owners expense.

11.0109- Keeping of Chickens

11.0110- Violations

Any person violating any provision of this article, other than if a penalty is specifically provided, shall be guilty of an infraction and fined a sum not more than five hundred dollars. In addition to the foregoing penalty, any person who violates this article shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food, handling, and veterinary care necessitated by the enforcement of this article.

11.0111- Penalties Under Chapter 11  
Any person violating any of the Chapter 11 articles for which a penalty is not specifically provided shall be penalized the following:

A. A first and second offense within a one year period of time shall be an infraction and be fined a sum not to exceed \$500.00.

B. A third offense within a two year period of time shall be a misdemeanor and may be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00.

C. Any additional offenses within a two year period, in the discretion of the Goodrich Municipal Court, may include any of the following:

1. A misdemeanor with the penalties as provided herein.

2. Removal of any animals of the person convicted of this offense.

3. An order prohibiting the person convicted of this offense from owning or caring for any animal in the city of Goodrich. This prohibition may be removed by the Goodrich Municipal Court, with any conditions the court deems appropriate.

Any costs of impoundment may be placed on the owner or keeper.
