

Farmers Union to mark 92nd youth camp season

Organization offers discounts for early summer camp sign-up

(JAMESTOWN, N.D.) — North Dakota Farmers Union opens its 92nd season of youth summer camps in June for kids who have completed grades 3-6 and 7-12.

The program annually draws more than 1,100 farm and city kids from across the state to the shores of Lake Tschida near Elgin and the Jamestown Reservoir, where camp facilities are located.

“‘Rooted in adventure’ is our camp theme this year,” said NDFU Education Director Miranda Letherman. “There’s always an element of adventure and fun at Farmers Union Camp, and we hope more kids will experience it this summer.” Sixteen separate four- and five-day camps are slated from June to August.

Team building exercises, leadership skill development and cooperative learning are core camp objectives, noted Letherman. “We also offer everything from theme nights to lake time, dances, skill-



building activities and more. There’s something for everyone.”

Discounts are being offered to those who register before May 15. Farmers Union also provides scholarships for kids needing financial assistance

to attend. Free motor coach transportation to and from camp facilities is also offered.

Have AI-related companies driven stock gains since the launch of ChatGPT?

Yes.

Though it is difficult to quantify the exact degree to which AI-related stocks have contributed to stock gains, analyses have found it is a key driver.

A September 2025 J.P. Morgan report noted that since the launch of ChatGPT (November 2022), AI-related stocks had been responsible for 75% of S&P 500 returns and

80% of earnings growth. Furthermore, according to RBC Wealth Management, seven AI-oriented stocks represented over half of the S&P 500’s total gains during 2025.

Beyond stock gains, the St. Louis Federal Reserve estimated AI capital expenditures accounted for 39% of total GDP growth in 2025. However, Goldman Sachs’ chief economist argues that since much of AI investment was spent

on imported inputs, they had a negligible impact on economic growth in 2025. An MRB analysis found accounting for imports, AI-related investments only contributed between 20% and 25% of 2025 real GDP growth.

to alter it.” The claim by one nation of authority to dictate or drag others into its “offensive war,” Hamilton, borrowing from Vattel, “would disturb the tranquility of nations, to excite fermentation and revolt everywhere.” France, in 1793, like Trump in 2026, lacked such authority.

No treaty at international law obligates a signatory state to defend a nation that

has commenced war. In fact, no treaty in U.S. history has purported to create such an obligation. There is no principled reasoning in the assumption that sovereign states can be held hostage by another’s decision to start a war. Such an admission would amount to surrender of a nation’s sovereignty.

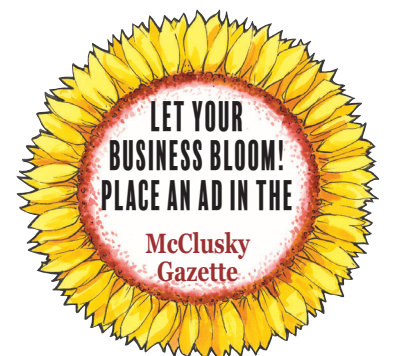
