March 3, 2026

The Sheridan County Board of County Commissioners met at 9:30 a.m. right after the County Park Board meeting. County Commissioners present were Shannon Dieterle, Sandra Felchle and Roddy Schilling.

Chairman Dieterle called the meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meeting were sent out by mail and email. It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to correct the minutes to read \$35 per mowing and not \$35 per hr, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

The Auditor reported the Courthouse Community Room floor is upheaving in areas. The Auditor was instructed to contact concrete/foundation contractors to get estimates for the April meeting to consider. The food pantry and extension office will be notified of moving there storage items to another place temporary in the near future.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to round up the mileage rate from .7250 to .73 to accommodate the county software, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle -yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to instruct the Auditor to advertise for bids for

restoration of the exterior walls of the courthouse that a contractor will require a performance bond, liability insurance and a contractor's license with the State of N.D., seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried. Bid letting will be opened April 7th at 10:30 a.m.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to accept the 12 month rate of 3.8% rather than the 11 months as stated last month on Bravera CD for the County, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by County Commissioner Schilling to enter into a funding agreement with the State Court Administrators office for 2027-2029 biennium for reimbursement of clerk of district court services, seconded by County Commissioners Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Schilling – yes, Felchle – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

Discussion on the county paying for the County spelling bee trophies was held at this time. It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to pay for the County Spelling bee trophies once the McClusky/Goodrich School sends the bill, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by County Commissioner Schilling to approve the Police Service Contract with McClusky City for providing law enforcement functions as stated in the contract for total amount of \$40,007.53, seconded by County Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Schilling – yes, Felchle – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

The time being 9:30 a.m. Tanya Mueller, Tax Director of Equalization, met with the board to report that she is hesitant to increase the value of ag land as approved at January meeting and rather just leave land value as last year being the County is at 98.5% of what the state tax dept is requiring us to be at already. It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to rescind the January motion of increasing land value to 1% to no change, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

Trent Naser, Sheriff, met with the board to discuss the holiday of Juneteenth (June 19th) that he recommended that day the courthouse should still be closed for the locked door schedule and not be a roaming day off in case the majority of employees would take off the same Friday, etc. and the doors would be unlocked.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to approve the request of the ND State Highway Patrol to conduct weight enforcement on Sheridan County roads, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

Byron Belile, Road Foreman, met with the board to discuss road issues. Belile stated he is ready to take the CDL test and Lee Wahl has to get his physical first to take CDL test. An 8'x16' mountain tarp will be advertised on the County facebook page for sale on best offer by April 7th Commission meeting to be considered. The muskrat agent letter needs to be renewed. The new LED lights were installed on the motorgraders. A windshield and a corner glass window is being changed out in two motorgraders with rock flying up. If weathers stays warm the wings will be taken off the motorgraders soon. Schilling questioned why the north McClusky pavement was not being sanded when icy. Belile reported it was done later that same day. Schilling inquired on the routes of the Blademen and for Belile to get that done on paper for each County Commissioner to have. Pulling edges of the roads in when blading is able was suggested. Crushing gravel was discussed to work on getting sites and a crusher lined up. Continue removal of trees in the ditches helps keeping snow off the roads. Belile's phone died so Naser will be ordering a new one.

It was moved by County Commissioner Schilling to approve the Load Limit Resolution effective to be posted on March 12th, seconded by County Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Dieterle – yes, Schilling – yes, Felchle – yes Resolution was declared adopted.

LOAD LIMIT RESOLUTION

The Board of County Commissioners again appeals to the public for cooperation in observing LOAD LIMIT REGULATIONS on County Roads. Due to the present conditions of the roads it is absolutely necessary to observe these restrictions if roads are to be saved this Spring:

SINGLE AXLE – 300 pounds per inch width of tire, plus 2,000 pounds, not to exceed 12,000 pounds

TANDEM AXLE – 300 pound per inch width of tire, not to exceed 12,000 pounds per axle

NOT TO EXCEED 6 TONS PER AXLE.

In case road restrictions are not observed it will be necessary to enforce the law regarding such restrictions.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to approve the Conditional Use Permit as recommended by the County P & Z board to Fisher Sand & Gravel Co., Dickinson for mining gravel on the Michael Faul property located in SE4 19-149-75, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by County Commissioner Felchle to appoint Brian Galvin – 4 year term, Gerald Spear – 4 year term, Karen Konschak – 4 year term to the P & Z Board, seconded by County Commissioner Schilling. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

It was moved by County Commissioner Schilling to approve a Joint Powers Agreement

with the cities in Sheridan County and the McClusky-Goodrich School to coordinate the holding of their general election along with the County's Primary Election, seconded by County Commissioner Felchle. Upon roll call vote – Felchle – yes, Schilling – yes, Dieterle – yes Motion carried.

The narrative from the County Agent was filed and read. Lea Mittleider reported on the ND State Crop Show, Pesticide Training & Wheat Commodity Elections and attending a leadership meeting in Ramsey County.

Abatement hearings for David C. Dietz for on a mobile home located in Section 18-146-75 will be held April 7th at 9:30 a.m. and Timothy & Julie Bischke on SE4NW4 21-150-74 will be held April 7th at 9:45 a.m.

The Auditor reported a building permit was issued to Allan & Cyiera Isaak for adding on a 24'x46' 2-bedroom addition on a tract in NW4NW4 17-150-76.

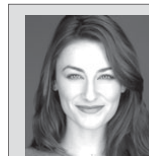
