Each bid must be accompanied

by a bidder's bond in a sum equal  
to 5% of the full amount of the bid  
executed by the bidder as principal  
and by a surety, conditioned that if  
the principal's bid is accepted and a  
contract is awarded to the principal,  
the principal, within ten (10) days  
after the notice of the award, shall  
execute a contract in accordance  
with the terms of the bid and the  
bid bond, and any conditions of the  
City of Wing, as required by law. A  
countersignature of a bid bond is not  
required. If the City of Wing elects  
to award a contract to the lowest  
responsible bidder, and the lowest  
responsible bidder does not execute  
a contract within ten (10) days, the  
bidder's bond will be forfeited to the  
City of Wing, and the City of Wing  
may award the project to the next  
lowest responsible bidder.

Each bidder must possess a valid  
North Dakota contractor's license  
for the full amount of their bid, as  
required by N.D.C.C. § 43-07-7. Each  
bidder MUST enclose a copy of their  
Contractor's License or Certificate of  
Renewal, issued by the North Dakota  
Secretary of State, and each license  
must be valid and dated at least  
10 days prior to the date set for bid  
opening, as required under N.D.C.C.  
§ 43-07-12.

This project anticipates funding  
from the Drinking Water and/or  
Clean Water State Revolving Fund  
program. Bidder's attention is called  
to the SRF requirements in the bid  
package.

Bidders on this work will be  
required to comply with American  
Iron and Steel requirements of the  
Consolidated Appropriations Act,  
2014. The requirements for bidders  
and contractors under this regulation  
are explained in the specifications.

Bidders are required to comply  
with Davis-Bacon prevailing wage  
requirements.

Any lead service line replacements  
conducted under this project must  
replace the entire lead service line,  
not just a portion, unless a portion  
has already been replaced or is  
concurrently being replaced with  
another funding source.

Bidders on this work will be  
required to comply with the  
President's Executive Order No.  
11246, as amended. The requirements  
for bidders and contractors under  
this order are explained in the Project  
Manual.

Bidders are required to comply  
with Build America, Buy America Act  
Requirements.

water rate in paragraph B.2  
of the original water supply  
contract for demand flow  
service dated Feb. 16, 2005,"  
the notice to the city stated.  
"The rate increase ... is due  
to increases in operation  
and maintenance expenses."

In a public notice, also  
published in the Jan. 21 edi-  
tion of the Leader-News,  
the city of Wilton approved  
adding a \$0.10 increase to

its users, taking the rate  
of \$5.53/1,000 gallons to  
\$5.68/1,000 gallons effec-  
tive with the February 2026  
billing cycle.

at," Hilzendeger said. "Our
