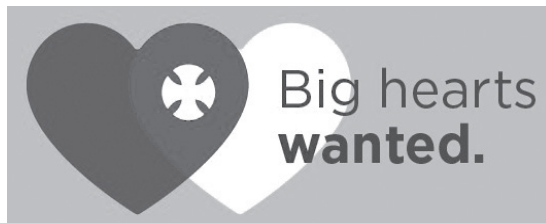

Hedstrom to approve the meeting minutes the March 4, 2026 as presented. All present voted aye, motion carried.

Motion made by L. Hedstrom and seconded by Tooke Hedstrom to approve the agenda as presented. All present voted aye, motion carried.

Ron Hochhalter submitted a public comment card concerning the amount of sand being used on the roads.

City Engineer was present to discuss the settling issue with the patches from the improvement project.

volunteer service,” the policy stated. “An employee called to provide emergency volunteer service cannot receive compensation for both work hours and emergency volunteer service. Compensation for emergency volunteer service may be retained by the employee if the employee is on authorized McLean County annual leave.”

The policy goes on to note, accrual for benefit calculations like annual leave, sick leave and holidays remain unaffected.

“Not only do I move to approve (the re-

quest) but I thank her for doing it,” said Commission Vice Chairman Steve Cottingham.

Commissioner Steve Lee agreed stating many of the volunteer services are “really struggling” when it comes to help.

“I think as a county we should do whatever we can to encourage participation,” Lee said.

Chairperson Curt Olson concurred with his fellow commissioners, saying their service is vital to the McLean County Community.
