IV. Standing Reports

A. Athletics/Activities Report - We have two girls (Senior and 8th grader) out for Speech, they both are doing well and have placed at meets. Mr. Yetterboe has talked to a teacher about being a speech

advisor next year. Having our own speech coach would save the school money and possibly more would go out. Elementary Boys Basketball started on March 16th, they have 15 boys out from 5th and 6th grade. There is 1 home school student and no one from Wing. Elementary Volleyball started March 16th, with 30 girls out from 4-6th grades, 26 girls are from Wilton. Varsity Boys Basketball had a great season. They lost in the state qualifier by 2 points. We had roughly 30 spectators at the school to watch the game in the commons area. We also had a very successful JV and C squad season. There is a bright future for the boys program. Varsity Girls Basketball didn't make it to regionals this year. They got hit by the injuries at the end of the season again. They were a very young team with no seniors, but they too bring back a lot of young talent and should be an improved team. Softball started on March 16th, with 31 girls out in 7-12th grade. There are 9 from Steele, 9 from Wing, and 13 from Wilton. Archery had State this past weekend in Minot, 4 individually qualified for Nationals. Track started on February 23rd. An update on participation is not available due to Mr. Stamstad being out on paternity leave. All Wilton coaches are certified through the state, they attend clinics and take classes on concussions, heat illness, First Aid & CPR, and sport specific workshops to stay certified. There was discussion on what requirements are needed for the athletes and community to use the weight room. Superintendent Jordan will follow up on a plan that will include a waiver for using the weight room and finding out what insurance requirements are. Having an introductory weight training class would be required before being able to use the weight room. Mr. Yetterboe attended an Athletic Director's meeting, Where it was discussed that schools are charging the following rates for athletic events \$10 adults, \$7 Senior Citizens, and \$5 students.

B. Principals Report - Student Led Conferences were held Monday March 16th and Tuesday March 17th. Attendance totals for the Elementary were 97% and Secondary were 96%. The preschool screening was on February 24th, with a full day of new Preschool and Kindergarten kiddos joining us! Spring Evaluations are in full swing; they are due April 15th. March is Reading Month and there have been fun activities planned all month for the kids. Dress up days, reading buddy days, and cookies for sale are a few of the fun activities

they have planned. Energy Day is March 27th. PTO helps decorate and provide some prizes and admin has a fun day planned.

C. Superintendent Report - The BSR 6 & 7 survey will go out to school board members in early April. The Strategic Priority #1 Academic Success will be reported out in April. March 19th and 20th was Spring Break. The Board Self-Evaluation survey will be distributed in May, and we will go over the results in our June meeting. Superintendent Jordan is the President-Elect for NDASA, he is supposed to attend a day and a half State Leaders Conference in Atlanta at the end of April. Superintendent will keep us informed if he goes.

A. School Board Committees - Negotiations Committee met before this board meeting. The committee decided to have another meeting to discuss administration raises and then have a Special meeting next week to approve the administration raises.

VI. Unfinished Business

A. Building Project Update- Superintendent Jordan gave the latest update on the project. John Deis and Jesse Brewer from Consolidated Construction to walk through and make a list of what is left to complete. Completion is expected in April. Still working on the boiler issues; that manufacturer, electrical engineer, and Advance Mechanical are all working to figure it out. The High School Science room still has several items that need to be completed. Mike Herner from Dakota Community Bank emailed us and is willing to do a grill out for the community open house in April or May. Clay Hetletved from Otter Tail inquired about the pole that was moved to complete the parking lot and asked if it should be moved back.

B. Redwood Agreement- In the board packet was the agreement for use of Redwood Building that the lawyer drew up. Clay Hetletved from Otter Tail and two other electrical companies were at Redwood to discuss what would be needed to get the electrical up to code and turned back on. The rough estimate from them was \$5000 to \$8000. The food pantry is asking if we would be willing to share the cost. The water at Redwood still needs to be connected to the building. There are a couple of grants that we are looking into. Schuh/Gregoyk moved to approve the agreement for use of the Redwood building between Wilton Public School District and the Wilton Food Bank as presented.
