NOTICE OF HEARING ON PETITION TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE CERTAIN SECTION LINE ROADS

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a Petition has been filed by The Falkirk Mining Company, P.O. Box 1087, Underwood, North Dakota 58576, with the Board of McLean County Commissioners requesting that the following section line roads be temporarily closed in order to conduct surface coal mining and reclamation operations:

a. The section line road between the SW4 of Section 1 and the NW4 of Section 12, Township 144 North, Range 84 West

b. The road located on the quarter line between the NW4 and SW4 of Section 12, Township 144 North, Range 84 West

c. The road located between the E2 and W2 of Section 12, Township 144 North, Range 84

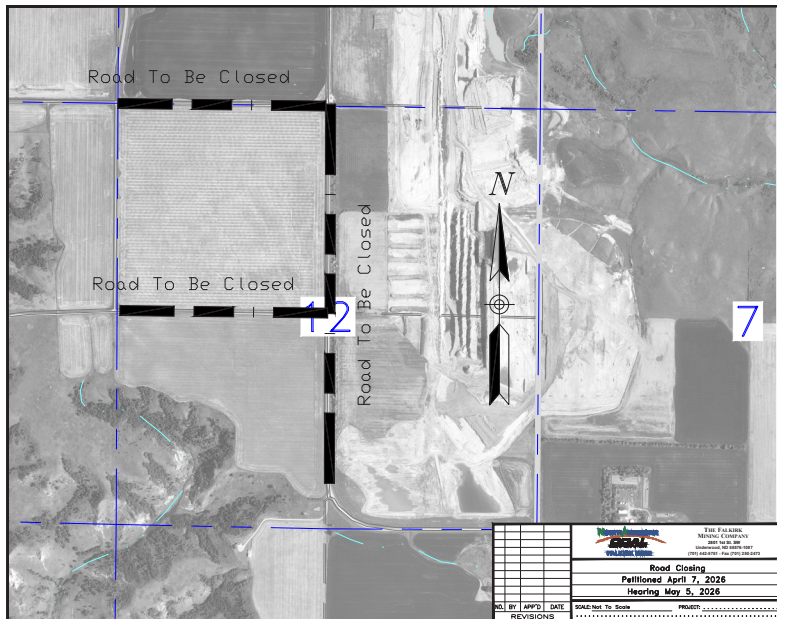
After the completion of surface coal mining and reclamation operations, Falkirk will restore the closed sections line roads to as good

a condition as existed prior to the closing of such roads to the extent required by the Board of McLean County Commissioners.

A hearing on the Petition will be held by the Board of McLean County Commissioners in the McLean County Courthouse at Washburn, North Dakota, on the 5th day of May, 2026, at 9:00 a.m., CDT, for the purpose of receiving testimony and evidence bearing upon the above request by Falkirk. Statements may be made orally or in writing at the time of the public hearing. The Petition, along with the map showing the effected section lines, is on file in the office of the McLean County Auditor and may be viewed by interested persons during regular office hours.

always warm up and come out of their shell."

The Washburn site is supported by volunteer mentors Kayla Henke, Sarah Kraft, Emmy Barnick, Lacey Pflipson, Rachel Frigon and junior mentor Delyla Holznagel. Local sponsors for the 5K included TruCommunity Bank, Dakota West Credit Union, Western Frontier Insurance, Hetletved CPA and Cottingham Insurance.

One of the mantras used throughout the season — "worthy without trying" — resonated with the group, Schaan said. The phrase encourages girls to recognize their value without tying it to performance or achievement. Schaan's 8-year-old daughter Jewel summed up the message in her own words: "You learn to encourage others and yourself."

For mentors, the 5K serves as the visible culmination of the season's work, but not the end of it.

"The finale is always the big affirmation of our why," Hair said. "It takes a lot of time to prep lessons, recruit mentors, fundraise and organize, but it's always worth it when the girls can reach their goals."

Families crowded near the finish line Sunday, with mentors stretching a crepe-paper ribbon across the path so every participant could break through it. Parents took photos, snacks were passed around and girls swapped stories from the run while waiting for friends to finish. The season closed with the same message the program is built on: helping girls understand what it means to be beautiful. Inside and out.
