May 1

Deputies responded at about 8:15 a.m. to the 1000 block of Borderlane in Washburn for a fire call. The call was reported by an alarm company stating a carbon monoxide alarm was activated. The alarm was cleared and it was determined to have a band sensor.

Deputies responded at about 10:15 a.m. to the intersection U.S. Highway 83 and N.D. Highway 200 in Washburn for a motorist assist. It was determined the car off the roadway was having battery issues. The battery was disconnected and the vehicle will be on hits way again.

Deputies responded at about 11 a.m. to the 700 block of Sixth Borchardt Avenue in Underwood for a welfare check. The reporting party stated they got into an argument on the phone with their significant other and they were afraid they might harm themselves.
